The Eugene Association of Realtors and St. Vincent de Paul Society of Lane County are sponsoring the first annual Christmas CanTree to provide canned food for needy people during the holidays.

The CanTree will be decorated with Christmas lights and will be displayed at Image One in the Gateway Mall from Nov. 13 through Dec. 25. People wishing to participate may drop off cans of food at Image One or at their local realty office.

Nita Bohannon, CanTree chairperson, is enthusiastic about the program. "This is a great way for our community to reach out to others," she said.

The Christmas CanTree program started in California in 1978 and is now a nationwide program. Approximately 3,500,000 cans, or 1,750 tons of

food, were donated statewide in its first year of operation.

Bohannon hopes that the CanTree will generate several thousand pounds of canned food this season, especially items high in protein such as chili, tuna and peanut butter.

The barrels of food are delivered to St. Vincent de Paul's Social Services Office on the corner of Highway 99 and Roosevelt. From there the food is distributed to homeless or low-income individuals and families.

"We make 600 Christmas food baskets for families this time of year," Rebecca Larson, St. Vincent de Paul community resource coordinator, said.

"When you're at the point of wondering where your next meal's going to come from, this donated food helps a lot," Larson said.


