Clothes: New Cotton Bowl apparel designs expected by this weekend

that the demand for Cotton Bowl merchandise isn't that high this year. The popularity of the Cotton Bowl could mirror that of Washington's Rose Bowl appearances, he said.

When Washington went to the Rose Bowl in 1991 for the first time since 1982, its fans, like Oregon's, "went into a frenzy over merchandise," Campbell said. Sales of Rose Bowl clothes were almost nil when Washington cruised to the Rose Bowl in 1992, even though Washington won the national championship that year.

"By the time Washington went to the Rose Bowl for a third time (in 1993), they had a hard time even having people steal merchandise," Campbell said.

Fewer units of Cotton Bowl merchandise mean less of a selection to choose from at the University Bookstore. Beverly

Emery, sportswear department manager at the bookstore, said part of the reason for the dearth in selection is that the majority of her vendors are manufacturing merchandise for the Rose Bowl.

Still, she said, sales of Cotton Bowl clothes are higher this season than the year before when the football team went to Pasadena. Last year, the bookstore generated an estimated record \$1.5 million in sales of Rose Bowl items.

Emery said she is expecting another shipment of Cotton Bowl merchandise with five more designs to arrive this weekend.

"Students are smart," Emery said. "The Cotton Bowl isn't for another month, and traditionally, students buy more just before they leave for vacation."

The bookstore is also planning to set up shop in Dallas to sell additional merchandise when Oregon fans descend on Texas.
