The Ducks take on another Division II team Saturday night as Alaska-Fairbanks comes to McArthur Court.

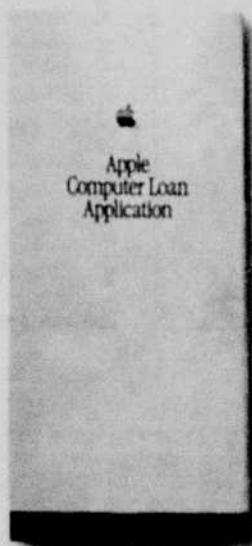
The Nanooks, who play in the Pacific West Conference, finished with a 12-15 record last year. They return four players from last year, including three starters.

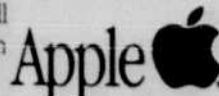

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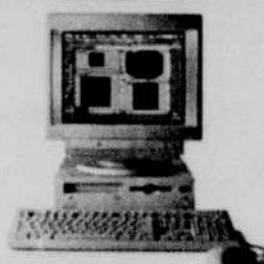
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
