Blazers make moves to compensate injuries

■ NBA: Portland signs a guard and a center to fill voids on its roster

PORTLAND (AP) — The Portland Trail Blazers filled out their injury-depleted roster Wednesday by signing former NBA players Rumeal Robinson and Elmore Spencer.

Robinson has played the last two seasons in the Continental Basketball Association and was averaging 22.9 points per game with the Connecticut Pride. He fills the void left by the injury to backup point guard Randolph Childress, who underwent surgery

to repair his dislocated left shoulder Tuesday.

Robinson, the 10th pick in the 1990 NBA draft, played five seasons in the NBA with Atlanta, New Jersey and Charlotte. He averaged 8.9 points and 4 assists in his NBA career.

The 7-foot, 270-pound Spencer will fill a backup center role behind Chris Dudley and Arvydas Sabonis. Spencer started the season with Denver, appearing in six games. The former UNLV player was the 25th player chosen in the 1992 draft by the Los Angeles Clippers.
