common in part-time than in full-time enrollment. It is not clear if the declines were due to students transferring to private institutions.

There is a flip side to this theory, however.

"The untold story of our colleges," Pierce said, "is the continuing increase in non-credit enrollments, including such areas as specialized training for business and industry, which are not routinely monitored by reporting agencies."

Other reasons for the decline may include the transplant of students on the East Coast to universities located on the West Coast. New York, New Jersey and Connecticut experienced the greatest declines, while Washington State, Oregon and Ari-

zona experienced increases.

While public institutions experienced declines, enrollment in independent institutions remained relatively stable.

Despite signs that enrollment is stabilizing in many states, the U.S. Department of Education predicts that the number of students attending colleges and universities nationally will rise slightly this year, from 14.3 million to 14.4 million.

The Department of Education is also forecasting a slow but steady increase in the total number of students enrolled. This could result in a gain of 1 million students in higher education institutions in the next seven years.

The study does not state if this may be due to employer-mandated retraining of its work force.

"I am strong in those issues, and I have experience in the community," Fodor said. "I work well with a wide range of folks."

Fodor is the founder of Friends of Eugene, a community organization working to encourage and facilitate citizen involvement in community planning and public policy development.

He is also the founder of Energy and Environmental Planning Associates, a consulting firm based in Eugene. EEPA specializes in community and regional planning with an emphasis on environmental sustainability.

Eugene is a small, friendly community with the outstanding environment of clean air, clean water, trees and beautiful mountains, Fodor said. "I want to preserve those things."

Fodor also said he wants to create a green belt system, or a belt

of park land, around the city.

He said we have a shortage of parks around the city, and he wants to protect the few parks we do have and the natural habitat of Eugene.

Fodor said he moved to Eugene because of its high quality of natural environment and the community.

Fodor received both a master's degree in environmental studies and a master's in urban and regional planning from the University in 1994.

As a recent graduate from the University, Fodor said he understands the students concerns, and he is an advocate for the students, faculty and the University as a whole.

"The University makes a major contribution to the town," Fodor said.

It contributes to the cultural and intellectual resources, the

diversity and to the economy, he said.

The University has been overlooked and ignored by the political system and the government, city and county, he said. He intends to increase representation of the students and faculty.

He said he wants to inform the people in the community better and make it easier for them to find out what the government is doing and how to get involved.

City Councilwoman Barbara Keller, NAACP president Henry Luvert, EWEB member Jeff Osanka and Eugene police officer Marvin Re'Voal have announced their candidacy.

A primary election will be on May 21. There will be a run-off in November between the primary's top two vote-getters, unless one of the candidates in the primaries can earn 50 percent of the votes.
