Willamette Street project budget. The remaining \$520,000 is hoped to come from urban renewal funds, or funds that can only be spent on downtown Eugene projects.

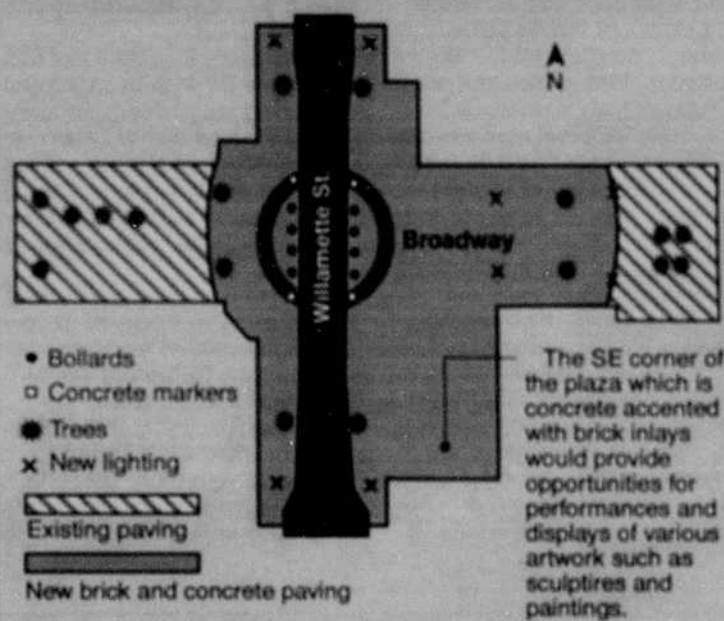
Douglas Beauchamp, committee chair, said the plaza is Eugene's center of activity.

"It's the emotional and symbolic heart of Eugene," Beauchamp said.

Additional improvements include:

- Permanent elements suggested are benches and low walls.
- Buildings will be cleaned and wall cracks repaired.
- Existing light fixtures will be replaced on concrete columns.
- Extra underground utilities will be installed to accommodate performances in the area if the project is accepted.
