forward Kyle Milling, averaging 8.1 rebounds per game, and Poppink, who is averaging 7.6 rebounds. Milling will also be looking for help from junior center Rob Ramaker, who brought down a season-high 13 rebounds against the Huskies. All three of these players are ranked in the conference top 10 in rebounding.

The Ducks, who are averaging 82.1 points per game, will face a Stanford defense that holds opponents to an average of 66.8 points per game.

Oregon head coach Jerry Green said Stanford will be tough to beat.

"Stanford is a little bit different than they were in the past because they are smaller," Green said. "But they have supposedly one of the best backcourts in the nation with Knight. Knight is a great penetrator and shooter."

After the loss to Washington, Green saw things that need to be improved in order to beat Stanford.

"[Washington] went into the zone and we didn't attack it,"

Green said. "We were very hesitant about attacking it. We can't do the bad things. We can't turn it over 25 times."

"We've just got to do better than that," Green said. "If you can do it in practice, you've got to do it in games."

Oregon will take the show on the road tonight and try to defeat Stanford to go 3-1 on the season.

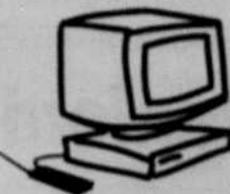
