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Candy bar can't cure Oregon's pains

For the members of the Oregon men's basketball team, there is a sort of hunger, way in the bottom of each of their stomachs, that just keeps growling game after game.

Only one thing can satisfy that hunger, and this time a Snickers bar just won't do — this hunger can only be satisfied by victory.

The Ducks are on a five-game losing streak that just won't seem to go away. After beating Oregon State and Washington State at home and compiling a 9-4 overall record, the Ducks dropped to 2-5 in the Pacific-10 Conference and 9-9 overall.

The Ducks have had three recurring problem areas: free-throw shooting, turnovers and inconsistent play from the team's veterans.

As a team, the Ducks are 93-of-155 from the charity stripe, good for an even 60 percent. But down the stretch, the Ducks have been streaky at the line as well as in the turnover department.

But the latter of the problems has been particularly hurtful and has forced head coach Jerry Green to rely on younger players to produce down the stretch.

"Our veterans perform one half, and then don't perform the next half, then you rely on the

younger people to get it done," Green said. "Probably the term inconsistent would be the best way to describe it. It would certainly describe our free throws, because we did shoot them good against Arizona, we didn't shoot them good against ASU. We had 23 turnovers against [Arizona State], we had 14 against a real good team, probably a better defensive team [in Arizona]."

And the near future doesn't look all that good for the Ducks, who face No. 19 UCLA Thursday night at the Pauley Pavilion.

The Bruins (13-5 overall, 6-1 Pac-10) suffered their only league loss to Arizona two weeks ago. UCLA can score, as forwards Charles O'Bannon (15.9) and J.R. Henderson (16.1) and guards Toby Bailey (15.8) and Kris Johnson (11.0) all average double-digits in points per game, while freshman center Jelani McCoy is just under the mark with a 9.9 average. As a team, UCLA is averaging 80.9 points per game.

That makes for a tough road game for the Ducks. But if you turn the tables and put the Ducks on a five-game winning streak, would it make a difference in the game?

"All the difference in a world," Green said. "If we had won five in a row right now, we would feel that we would not have to win the game to make the playoffs, and now we feel we have to win if we are going to make the playoffs. And they don't lose many in there, and they are nationally ranked and so on."

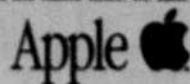
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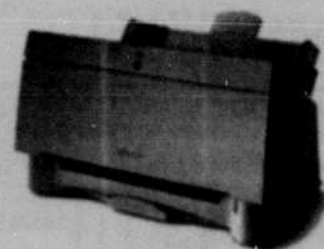
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
