Wild Duck brewing for grand opening

■ **BREWERY:** New pub to serve diverse menu and music, all flavored with hometown pride

As an army of construction workers dashed around the Wild Duck on Monday afternoon installing lights and putting together a shining new mahogany bar, brew master Glen Falconer stirred huge vats of steaming hops in preparation for tonight's opening of Eugene's newest brew pub.

Former University quarterback Chris Miller, who now plays for the St. Louis Rams, co-owns the restaurant and brewery. Miller started for the Ducks from 1984 to 1986 and will be present at tonight's grand opening, said Pat McCallum, another co-owner.

The Wild Duck will have five varieties of beer on tap, a fully stocked bar and a menu that offers everything from vegetarian entrees to wild duck, Falconer said. A music venue sits behind the restaurant where live bands will perform Friday and Saturday nights.

The Wild Duck will appeal to all tastes, said McCallum, who also owns the Tree House Restaurant and Lounge on Franklin Blvd. It will offer traditional pub foods, such as sandwiches and salads, but will also serve lunch and dinner entrees, costing on average \$6 or \$7.

"We really feel like we're offering a lot of diversity in what we're creating and that we have a little something for everyone," McCallum said.

McCallum hopes this will bring a wide cross-section of people through their doors.

"One of our goals is to provide a place for the community," he

said, "a place with some personality and character and a place that has some energy."

Both McCallum and Bob Jensen, another partner in the business, grew up in Eugene and have brought some hometown pride into their creation, McCallum said. They want to create an establishment of which Eugene can be proud, he said.

"We want to be Eugene's spot," McCallum said. "We want people to bring their out-of-town friends and relatives here."

McCallum and Jensen toured the country checking out different brew pubs and noting what made them successful, then built the Wild Duck around the elements they liked best, McCallum said. They designed a restaurant with an open kitchen and an easily visible brewery, he said.

"It's an interactive type of concept that your customers can see and feel," McCallum said.

The beer served will be unique

because each brewer has his own style, Falconer said. Falconer developed a taste for darker, bitter beer during multiple trips to England and Scotland where hops, a main ingredient in beer, are used liberally, he said. Falconer's love for hops was reinforced during his four years of brewing in Rogue River, where the motto is "when in doubt, use more hops."

The five beers on tap will include a stout, a bitter, a porter, a hefeweizen and a golden cream.

The music venue will feature an eclectic mix of acts, McCallum said. They will open tonight with Hoppa, a Hawaiian band featuring a champion hula dancer. The performance is sold out, but standing-room-only tickets may be sold at the door for \$14.

Body and Soul, an R&B band from Seattle, will perform Friday night. Tickets are \$7.

"We're not going to get locked into just one [type of music]," McCallum said.
