Dinner, dancing celebrate Singapore

■ **CULTURE:** Students created a night of multi-cultural festivities

More than 130 students celebrated the Singapore culture Sunday night in the EMU Ballroom.

Singapore Culture Night 1996, "Experience Beyond the Horizon," consisted of an authentic Singaporean dinner, a lion dance, a fashion show, a slide show, a martial arts performance and tributes to the Singapore's cultures.

"We would like to bring to you a glimpse of the different cultures of Singapore," said president of the Singapore Students' Association Stephanie Lim. "By the end of the night, we hope you'll have

a better understanding of Singapore and its culture."

Dave Hubin, executive assistant to University president Dave Frohnmayer, was the guest speaker of the evening.

"These international nights rival the Rose Bowl in terms of the pleasure I get," he said.

Hubin sent regards from Frohnmayer, who was unable to attend.

"If we didn't have meetings like this ... we would have very little," he said.

Guests of Singapore Cultural Night watched one of the oldest Chinese customs, the Lion Dance. The dance is usually used to usher in the Lunar New Year and to celebrate Chinese holidays and events.

China is one of three main cul-

tural groups in Singapore.

The other main cultural groups, Indian and Malay, were also represented. An Indian celebratory dance took place to demonstrate the Indian influence in Singapore.

About 4 percent of Singapore's population is Indian.

A traditional Malay dance was performed to show the importance of Malay culture.

"There was a lot of preparation for this," said Singapore Cultural Night coordinator Su-Lin Lim. "We've been down here all day getting ready."

Singapore, also known as the Lion City, hosts a population of 3.1 million people. Audience members saw a slide show, which showed many sights and views of the Lion City.
