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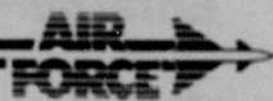
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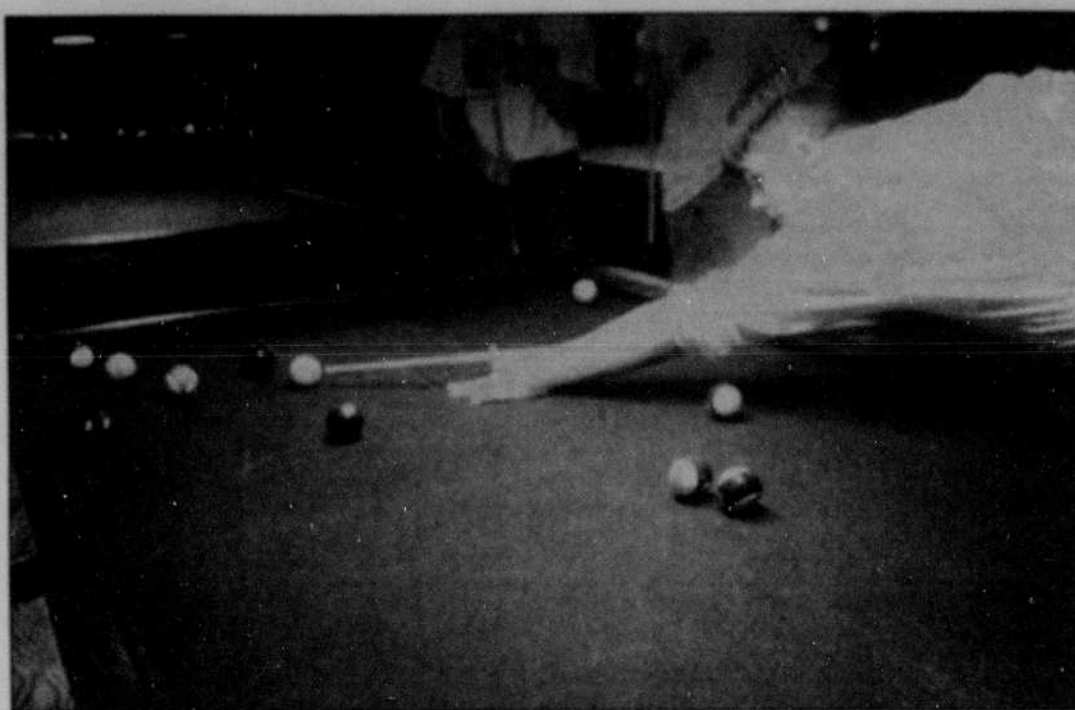

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Students celebrate Year of the Mouse

■ **CULTURE:** Vietnamese students featured cultural dances and skits

The Vietnamese Student Association (VSA) and about 200 guests celebrated the Vietnamese New Year with food, skits and dancing in the EMU Ballroom on Saturday.

"Voices of Tomorrow" was the theme of the evening commemorating the Year of the Mouse, part of the 12-year cycle of Vietnam's new years.

After a dinner that included traditional Vietnamese food such as shrimp rolls and ginger chicken, the performances began with a lion dance. Nghia Nguyen, one

of the hosts for the evening, said the dance is traditionally used to ward off evil spirits.

The performers from the Eugene Lion Dance Club covered themselves with dragon costumes and danced throughout the crowd to the rhythm of a loud drum beat.

"We always like to start the night off with a bang," said Cindy Nguyen, another host for the event.

After several dance and skit performances, the VSA presented "That's Cool, Man!," a musical comedy about adjusting to life in America.

VSA co-director Phong Nguyen, who wrote the script and choreographed the dance, said the comedy was simply a reflection of what he and many

of his friends have already experienced.

"We all know about coming over here and the adjustment," he said.

To end the evening, all of the singers, dancers and actors joined hands to sing to the audience, thanking them for coming.

Phong Nguyen said the VSA had been practicing for the event since last term, often as much as three times a week and on the weekends.

Despite the work, Nguyen was glad the event took place because of the constant need to educate the University community about Vietnamese culture.

"What we try to display is how our culture is, what we are adjusting to and how we are today," he said.

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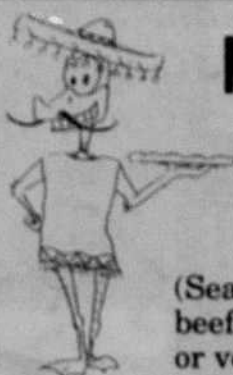
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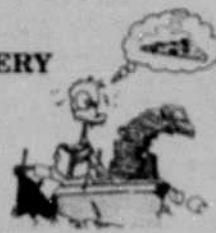
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
