

Error-plagued weekend less than peachy for Ducks in Georgia

■ **SOFTBALL:** 11 unearned runs lead to a 1-4 NSCA tournament finish

The Oregon softball team went 1-4 over the weekend in the NSCA Leadoff Classic tournament, dropping its overall record to 6-10.

The Ducks split the two games they played on Friday, losing the opener to 22nd ranked Hawaii for the third time in a week, then blanking Princeton 7-0 in the late game.

They lost both games of Saturday's doubleheader to Notre Dame and 13th ranked Florida

State. Oklahoma then eliminated Oregon with a victory on Sunday.

On Friday, Hawaii used a two-run sixth inning to break a 1-1 tie and take a 3-1 advantage. The Ducks rallied to within one in the bottom half of the inning to bring the score to 3-2.

But the Rainbows scored two in the top half of the seventh putting the game out of reach and giving them a 5-2 victory.

Both the offense and defense had sub-par games for the Ducks. The offense stranded ten base runners, while the defense gave up two unearned runs on three errors.

The loss was pitcher Jennie Cook's first of the year, giving

her a 2-1 record.

In the game against Princeton, freshman Sherri Woods pitched six innings of three hit ball to pick up her second win of the year. Rightfielder Kim Kampf had two hits and two RBI to pace the Ducks. Shortstop Kathy Stahl also had two hits.

In Saturday's games, the Ducks were outscored 10-2, giving up nine unearned runs including the only run scored in their 1-0 loss to Florida State.

The game against Florida State was scoreless going into the bottom of the sixth when Seminole Shamalene Wilson led off with a single and advanced to second on a fielder's choice. Wilson then came around to

score when Oregon centerfielder Lisa Preston overran a single by Jesse McGregor.

The loss went to Sherri Woods, who for the second day pitched six strong innings, giving up no earned runs and only three hits.

In the early game against Notre Dame, the Ducks took a 2-0 lead in the bottom of the fourth inning off an RBI single from Stahl that scored Angie LeRoy and an RBI single from Preston that scored Stahl.

But the Fighting Irish came roaring back, scoring seven runs in the fifth inning as Oregon committed four errors. With two more runs added in the top of the sixth, Notre Dame won the

game 9-2.

Oregon's error-plagued defense gave up eight unearned runs to Notre Dame, bringing their total to 11 unearned runs allowed in the first two days of the tournament.

Oregon finished the tournament on Sunday with an afternoon game against Oklahoma. After taking a 1-0 first inning lead, the Ducks allowed the Sooners to score four in the third off five singles and a passed ball.

That proved to be enough as the Ducks could only muster one more run to lose 4-2.

Stahl lead the Ducks' offense for the weekend, getting two hits in each of the four games.
