

# Softball: Tough games ahead

with a team low 3.13 ERA.

Oregon will also rely heavily on freshmen Sherri Woods and Jennie Cook to give them solid outings from the mound. Woods went 1-1, pitching two complete games and allowing no earned runs - including a shutout of Princeton - last weekend. Cook has a 2-1 record with a 4.74 ERA.

"We want to give those guys the opportunity to throw more games," Brown said. "We will mix them with Petrina Martinez and Katie Mackey, but those two are the go-to pitchers."

Offensively, the Ducks have been solid so far this year, averaging six runs per game. Senior shortstop Kathy Stahl leads the Duck batters with a .556 batting average, 30 hits, including two home runs, and 15 RBI. Second baseman Angie LeRoy is also having a big year with 21 hits and 15 runs scored while batting .420.

Along with Stahl and LeRoy, Brown will expect others to show up and perform.

"I will expect a lot from Trina Salcido and Lisa Preston," Brown said. "But I also will expect the freshmen to pick up the pace and perform under pressure and perform, period. So I expect every single one of them to do their jobs."

Preston has not disappointed. Batting .380, she has 19 hits and 18 RBI, equaling her RBI total for all of last year.

UCLA and Arizona are the obvious choices to win the Pac-10 title, but Brown said there is another team that should not be overlooked.

"Washington has a really good opportunity to win the entire conference," Brown said.

And who is the dark horse?

"Stanford. I have heard they have beaten some pretty good teams."
