

Goals: Bascom stresses trains, trails, trees

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vice position was chairwoman of the Mayor's Bicycle Committee in 1971.

She has only 10 months left to her term, which ends Dec. 31, 1996.

Her goals for her final months in office include improving public library facilities and increasing affordable housing and public safety.

She believes her biggest accomplishments as mayor include helping to create the Riverbank system and Eugene's first First Night, a downtown New Year's Eve festival.

Bascom said she enjoyed the great variety of appearances and will miss reaching out to the

community.

As of noon on Monday, seven people have filed as candidates for mayor of Eugene: Mike Albers, a student and Food Not Bombs activist; Neale Hyatt, consultant; Tim Laue, city councilman; Frank Soifer, retired iron worker and union organizer; Dave Sweet, citizen activist; Jim Torrey, city councilman; and Izzy Whetstone, railroad worker.

Bascom said she didn't endorse any particular candidate, but she did admit that "there is enough of a feminist in me that I thought of re-election just to take on the [seven] male candidates," she said.

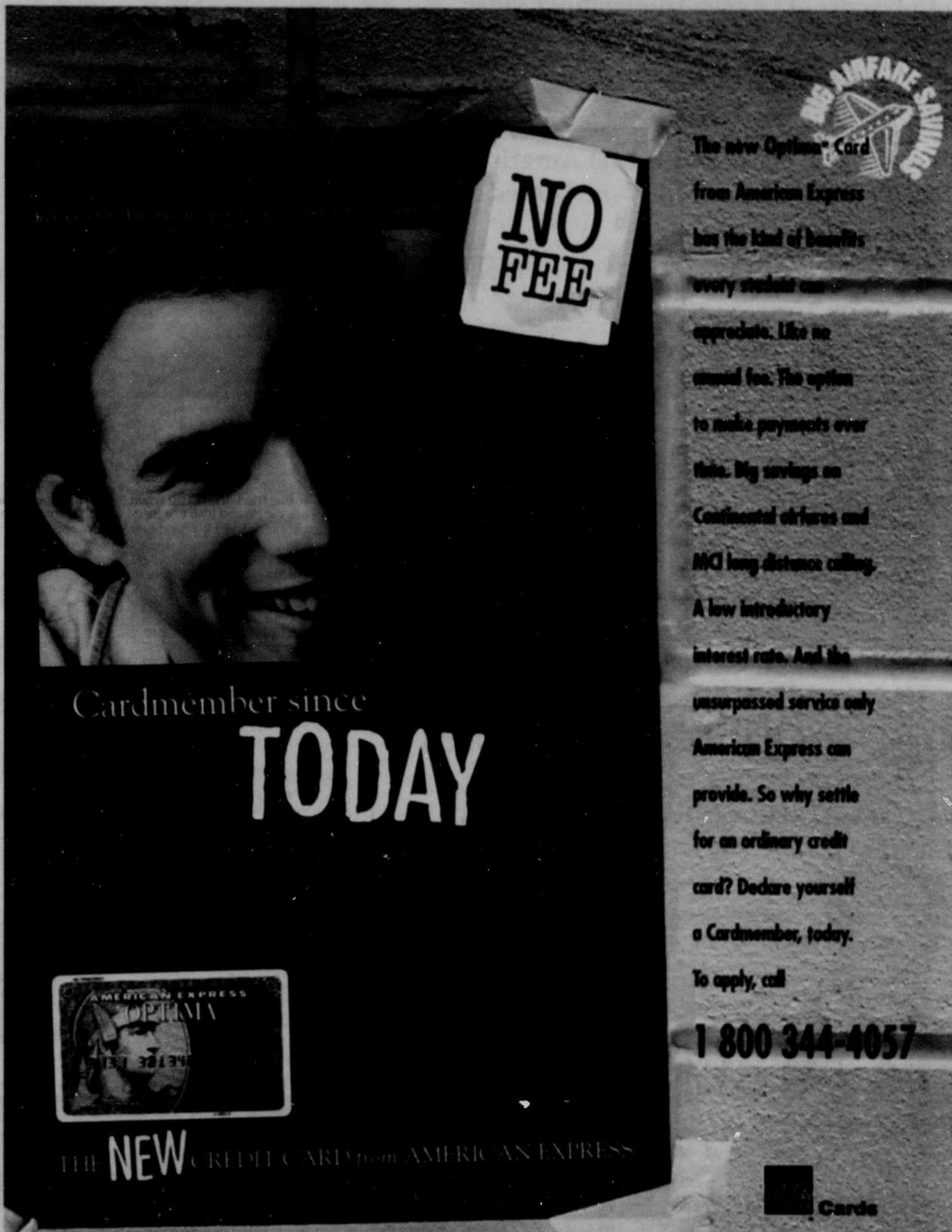
