It is crucial that University students attend the March to Fight the Right on April 14 in San Francisco.

This march will address the continued social injustice shown by the right wing movement in America — a movement that preserves the white-male dominated institution of power and keeps the masses of oppressed down.

The people most affected by the right wing movement are people of color, lesbians, gay

men, bisexuals and the poor. The march is looking to:

- Fight racism
- Protect abortion and reproductive rights

Keep Taiwan free

Just as the Taiwanese people are getting ready to cast ballots in their first-ever Presidential election in Taiwan on March 23rd, the Chinese government again conducts missile and military exercises off Taiwan's coast. This time, their targets are near two main Taiwanese ports, too close to be considered only a nuisance.

Even though the People's Republic of China regards Taiwan as a renegade province, the

fact remains that Taiwan has never been ruled by the PRC for a single day.

The Taiwanese people are now prepared to determine their own future, possibly opting for an outright independence by bona fide democracy. China, on the other hand, abuses human rights, sells nuclear technology to Pakistan, conducts nuclear tests, occupies Sparty Islands, suppresses Tibetan dissidents and pirates American intellectual properties.

In short, China is an authoritarian communist country with few democratic scruples.

The United States, even now, is showing its leadership on world democracies by sending the aircraft carriers Independence and Nimitz to the Taiwan Strait as a show of support and encouragement for the democratization process in Taiwan.

Obviously, these reckless and aggressive actions by China must be deplored. It is increasingly clear that appeasement is not an effective strategy against growing Chinese belligerency.

The United States must warn China that any future threats to the peace in the Taiwan Strait will no longer be tolerated and should any harm come to Taiwan through China's intent or accident, the United States should stand ready to assist with whatever force necessary to protect this nation's commitment and dedication to democracy.

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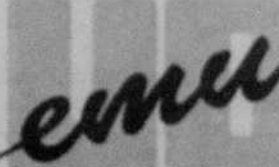
