

Funds: Large gifts contribute to funding

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"The Oregon Campaign fuels innovation on campus," Frohnmayer said. "It provides an incentive to take risks, to see if there are better ways to do things."

The largest gifts from the campaign so far include a \$10 million donation from California developer Charles H. Lundquist for the creating an entrepreneurial focus in the business school, and an \$8.7 million gift from Alec Keith, a Pennsylvania scientist, professor and pharmaceutical com-

pany founder.

Keith placed his gift in trust for the eventual support of undergraduate science education and creation of three new professorships. The Oregon Campaign has also received about a dozen gifts of approximately \$1 million.

The University's previous fund-raising campaign ended in 1989 and raised \$43 million to help fund the expansion and renovation of the Knight Library as well as support scholarships and academic programs.

Update: Details about shooting remain unclear

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Berger and Crompton parked their car in the area to maintain surveillance on Young after he stopped in the restaurant parking lot. The officers then saw Young get out of his car and enter a brown Buick, which just arrived in the same lot.

According to police reports, Berger and Crompton believed that a drug deal was taking place, and the officers moved toward the two cars to make an arrest. Young tried to speed away as the officers approached

him, and during that time Berger fired a single shot. After the shot was fired, the car continued to move forward through the restaurant parking lot and into a bank parking lot.

Last week, Sgt. Rick Gilliam told *The Register-Guard* that Young was apparently unarmed when he was shot but that police didn't know whether he had a weapon in the car.

Both officers were in plain clothes; however, independent witnesses have stated that the officers identified themselves as

police officers when they approached Young, according to a news release.

Berger, Crompton and Doe have all been placed on administrative leave pending the outcome of the investigation — standard procedure for officers involved in a police shooting.

Results of the investigation will be turned over to the Lane County district attorney's office for review late this week. Police are looking for witnesses who were in the area between 2:30 and 2:45 p.m.

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
