 conflict in Sudan to Friday's
 presentation during World
 Forum Day about discrimination
 in other countries.

Subir Dutta, the ISA's assistant
 director, said the wide
 range of events has not only
 been organized to give students
 an opportunity to learn about
 the various cultures of the globe,
 but also to help the ISA accom-
 plish a program goal of getting
 involved with other student
 organizations.

"Over the years, international
 students have been known as
 closed off [from other stu-
 dents]," he said. "This year we
 have networked with other
 groups and in that way we have
 done groundbreaking work to
 change that stigma."

The ISA is also using Interna-
 tional Week to educate students
 about the diversity of the cam-
 pus community. The student
 organization currently repre-
 sents more than 1,600 interna-
 tional students from more than
 88 countries.

"We're trying to make the
 University aware of how diverse
 it really is," Khan said. "There's
 been a long history of interna-
 tional students going to the Uni-
 versity and [the number of such
 students] is always increasing."

In addition to International
 Week events, the ISA will be
 presenting performances from
 around the world and serving an
 international dinner at Satur-
 day's International Night. To
 date, about 300 of the 600 tickets
 have been sold. Tickets are
