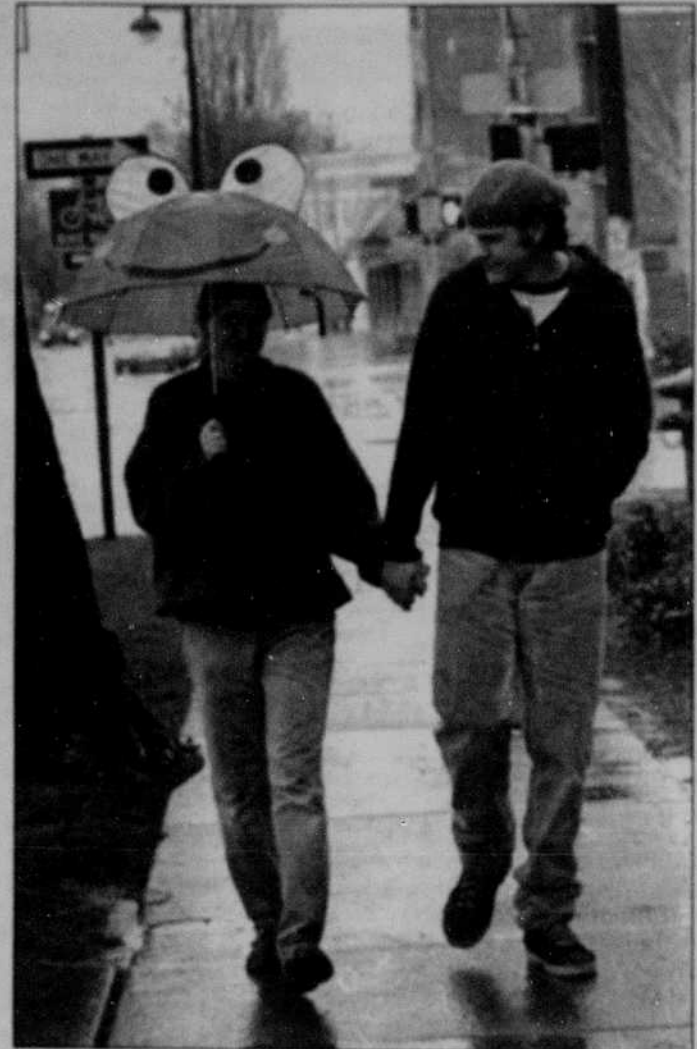

#### April proclaimed 'Christian Heritage Month' by governor

Gov. John Kitzhaber has officially proclaimed April as "Christian Heritage Month" in Oregon. People around the state will be celebrating through various events including a kick-off rally today at the steps of the Capitol building in Salem at noon, according to a news release. Other events planned include seminars by the well-known historian and author Dr. Peter Marshall. Churches, civic groups and schools are encouraged to conduct or sponsor programs celebrating "Christian Heritage Month."

#### Excavation work, flaggers slow traffic on West 11th Avenue

Excavation work for the new Hyundai plant on West 11th Avenue and Willow Creek Road is well under way, and construction is already affecting traffic on West 11th.

Flaggers are stationed on West 11th about half of a mile west of Beltline Road. Trucks and flaggers are present on the road from 6 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and from 6 p.m. to 4:30 a.m. including weekends. The excavation work is expected to continue for six to eight weeks.

#### Two one-way streets will become two-way

Jefferson and Washington streets, two one-way streets in the Whiteaker neighborhood, will be converted on Wednesday to allow two-way traffic. Construction will take place on Jefferson Street between First and Sixth avenues and Washington Street between Clark Street and Fifth Avenue.

Motorists may experience some minor delays while the work is being done, but one lane of traffic will be kept open as each street is changed.

According to a news release, the return to two-way traffic on the two streets is consistent with the policies in the Whiteaker Plan designed to improve through traffic routes in order to reduce traffic on residential streets. It will also improve access for emergency vehicles and provide more bus routing options.

The project may take two days.
