

Crime: OSU, PSU have frisking law

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Hick said.

"[This policy] will make it clear what authorization OPS officers have and allow them to perform their duties in a more effective manner," said Hicks.

OPS is behind in the process of establishing this policy compared with other colleges, said Hicks. The presidents of both Portland State University and Oregon State University have already approved the frisking policy.

The policy went into effect at PSU in mid-March, and officials at OSU expect to implement the policy in about two weeks, said university officials.

The bill was introduced to the state legislature early last year by the Oregon State System of Higher Education and came into effect Sept. 9, Hicks said. Oregon is one of the last states in the United States to introduce this kind of law, he said.

The bill required all OPS officials to go through a five-week training process and an eight-hour class specifically pertaining to stop and frisk procedures by the Oregon Police Academy. OPS officials have already graduated from the training program and are awaiting authorization from Reeves and University President David Frohnmayer.

Once the bill is approved, OPS employees will go through an internal training process before it goes into effect.

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The U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md., loses \$1.2 million each year on a dairy herd.

• Mickey Mouse Hotel — The Department of Defense has a 287-room "enchanted castle" in Orlando, Fla., run by the Morale, Welfare and Recreation program. The hotel loses \$27.2 million annually and must be federally subsidized.

• Third Golf Course — Andrews Air Force Base is scheduled to spend \$5.1 million to build its third premier golf course. Though intended for use of active and retired military personnel, the course will also be made available to Members of Congress due to its close proximity to the U.S. Capitol.

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• Misplaced \$15 billion — Over the last decade, Pentagon accountants have either misplaced or lost track of somewhere between \$15-30 billion. This includes double payments and overpayments to contractors as well as billions of dollars of unauthorized purchases.

• Perks for Defense Companies — In the past several years, Martin Marietta and its subsidiaries have charged the federal government \$263,000 for a Smokey Robinson concert in Denver, \$20,194 for professional quality golf balls over the last three fiscal years and \$7,589 in 1994 for a Christmas party, including a \$200 appearance by Santa Claus.

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
