

DeFazio takes time to survey University computer facilities

■ **CONGRESS:** The representative is using Congress' recess to tour key areas of the Fourth District

Rep. Peter DeFazio visited the University on Tuesday to get a hands-on view of the University's current computer facility needs.

While Congress is in recess, DeFazio is meeting with constituents and speaking to various groups throughout Oregon's Fourth Congressional District this week.

DeFazio makes regular campus visits, several times a year. A part of this visit was a tour of the Computational Science Laboratory and the Computing Center.

Two computer and information science professors and a geological science professor gave DeFazio a computer tour of the programs created by the students of the Computational Science Lab.

"Computational science is a revolution — a new thing in computer science," said Janice Cuny, associate professor of computer and information science.

Allen Malony, assistant professor of

computer and information science, said the lab is developing interactions with computer researchers to see how computational science can assist researchers.

The second computer facility DeFazio visited was the 30-year-old Computing Center.

Lucy Lynch, academic user support specialist, showed DeFazio several World Wide Web home pages that local high school students have created with help from the University.

"We showed Peter the terrible conditions we do wonderful things in at the Computing Center," said Pat Martin, assistant vice president for federal relations. "The computing issues in Deschutes are different than the computing issues in Johnson Hall."

After the tour of the computer facilities, DeFazio said the University has a need for a new center and he will work with Sen. Mark Hatfield to get the needed funds.

DeFazio also met with a government class at Lane Community College, the Eugene Chamber of Commerce, president Dave Frohnmayer and *The Register-Guard* 20-Below editorial students on

He will be in Waterville today, Roseburg on Thursday and Mapleton, Florence, Reedsport and Elkton on Friday. Next week, DeFazio will visit Philomath,

Albany and Corvallis.

"I have a very large and very diverse district," DeFazio said. "I keep in touch with it by spending time traveling around the district."
