"The number of free tests available will depend on how many tickets are sold," Knight said. "If we can sell all 1,000 tickets like we want to, then we will have about \$4,000 to go toward free tests. It all depends on how many people attend this concert."

The concert will feature the Eugene band, Floater, and two opening bands that will be chosen in a residence hall "Battle of the Bands" on April 19, Knight

said. At least one of the band members must be living in the residence halls to qualify, she said.

Tickets will be \$5 for in advance and \$6 at the door for students. General admission tickets are \$6 in advance and \$7 at the door. Tickets can be purchased starting April 6, at the EMU desk store, Face the Music, Green Noise, CD World, the Record Garden and House of Records.

Woman makes false theft report to test boyfriend's loyalty

DELAWARE, Ohio (AP) — A woman made up a story about having \$741,000 stolen to see if her boyfriend would still love her even without the money, authorities said.

Linda Kee was charged with making a false report, a misdemeanor punishable by six months in jail and a \$1,000 fine.

Kee, 33, had claimed the money was taken from a lock-box she buried in her flower bed. She actually did bury \$10,000, then dug up the box, removed the money and told her boyfriend the larger sum had been stolen, the sheriff's department said Wednesday.

Divorced with four children, Kee apparently had been involved with men only interested in her money, Detective Mike Askew said.

Kee admitted lying after detectives said the FBI would be called in because of the amount of money involved, Askew said.

Despite the charge, the couple remain together.

"Apparently he passed the test," Askew said.

Judge orders ad for HIV cure off the Web

DEDHAM, Mass. (AP) — A woman who advertised on the Internet that she had a cure for HIV, and urged callers to dial a 900-number, was ordered by a judge to take the ad off the World Wide Web.



"In six weeks you are HIV negative," the ad said, referring to the virus that causes AIDS. "Even near-terminal patients can recover."

Marjorie Phillips of Brockton offered the cure in a book for \$24, or through a 900-number at \$1.99 a minute.

Attorney General Scott Harshbarger, seeking to warn "other cyber-snakeoil salesman," obtained a temporary restraining order knocking the ad off the Internet on Tuesday.

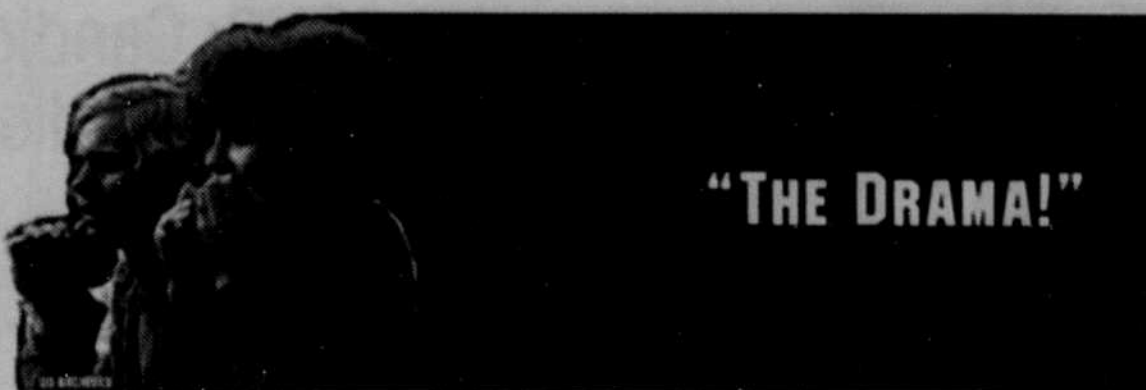
The book recommends using a compound of wormwood, cloves and black walnut hulls, said George Weber, who heads the attorney general's consumer protection and antitrust division.

Weber said there is no evidence those ingredients help treat AIDS. If his office determines that consumers bought the cure, Phillips could be prosecuted for fraud, Weber said.

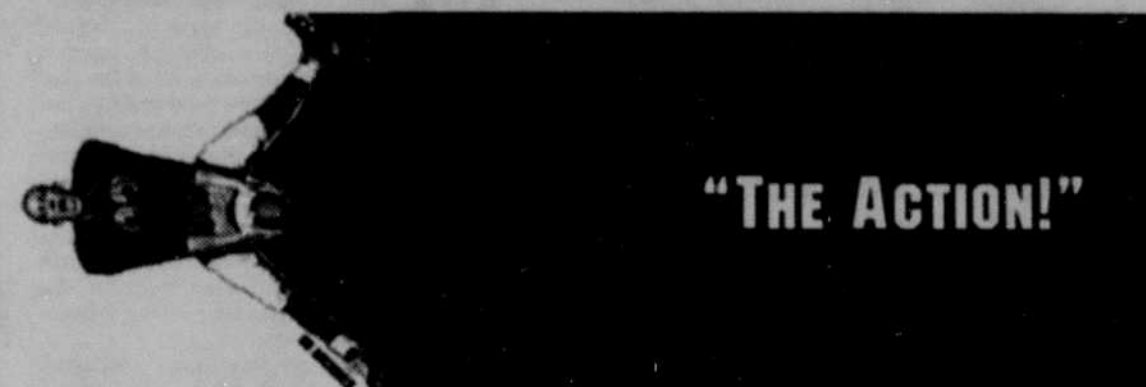
Phillips defended the ad.

"If I didn't believe it was a cure, I wouldn't have put it out there," today's editions of *The Wall Street Journal* quoted her as saying.

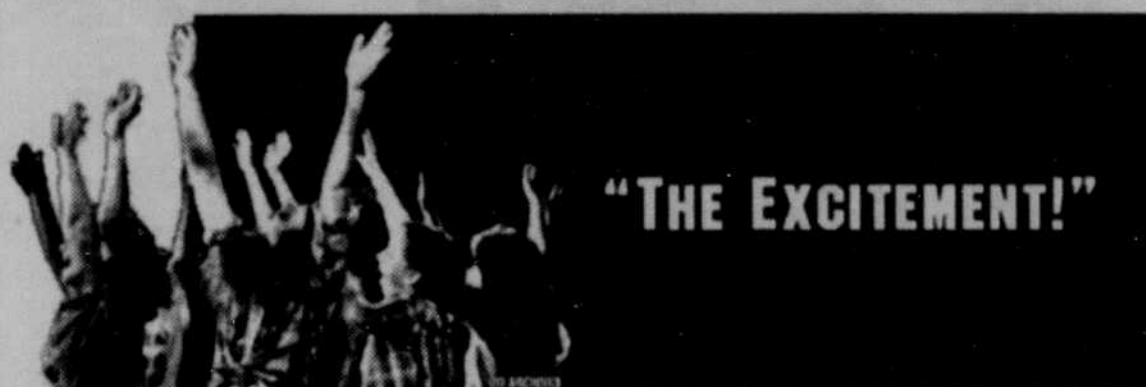
The state is seeking a permanent injunction against the advertisement. A hearing was scheduled for April 11.



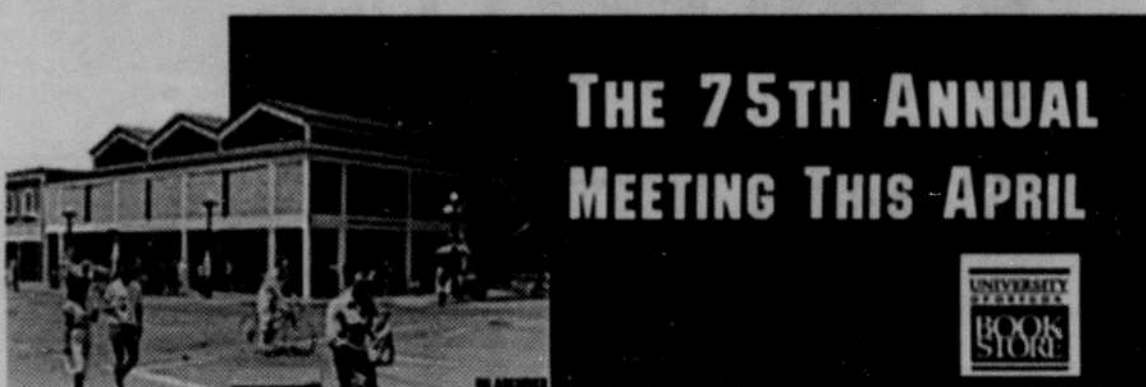

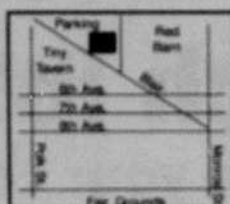
