

County campgrounds taking reservations

Lane County Parks is now accepting camping reservations for Richardson Park on Fern Ridge Lake and Harbor Vista Park in Florence.

Reservations can be made by calling Richardson Park at (541) 935-2005 and Harbor Vista Park at (541) 997-5987. The parks need the following information when making a reservation: dates, name, address, phone number and vehicle license number.

There is a non-refundable \$10 fee for making a reservation. They can be made from two weeks to one year in advance. To confirm a reservation, the first night's campsite fee plus the reservation fee must be paid within seven days of making the reservation.

Campsite fees at Richardson Park are \$15 per night and Harbor Vista campsite fees range from \$11 to \$15 per night.

A Cascadia Rail Stakeholder session will take place April 12 in Salem at the Black Angus Restaurant from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. The theme of the session is "Keeping Oregon Competitive." Oregon Business Council and the Cascadia Transportation/Trade Task Force are sponsoring the event.

Governor Kitzhaber and Fred Buckman, CEO of PacificCorp will address the luncheon. The rail options report also will be reviewed at the session.

Discussion at the session will include Oregon's partnership with Washington and British Columbia in the Cascadia Alliance to promote high speed rail, trade and tourism, and a bid

Competition ideas can become law

The 1996 Oregon Better Government Competition is seeking regulation and welfare reform ideas. The program is organized by Portland's Cascade Policy Institute.

Short "idea papers" (five pages or less) will be accepted through April 24. An independent panel of judges will review the papers and select up to 10 finalists. The finalists will then have over two months to transform their ideas into formal proposals.

Up to \$3,000 will be awarded to each finalist who needs funds to help develop their formal plans. Finalists whose formal proposals meet the criteria set for the competition will be announced as winners.

The competition winners then will be honored at a fall awards ceremony, and their ideas published and distributed to the media, foundations, public officials, and business, education and community leaders.

Eight winning ideas from the 1994 competition were introduced as legislation during the 1995 session. Of those, toll road legislation passed and foster care/adoption mediation reform passed as an amendment to a previous law.

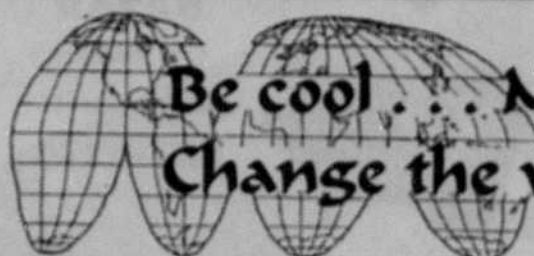
