Race: Results reported

board has not had final results until counting those cast at the Oregon Institute of Marine Biology, a University campus in Charleston, Ore.

This year, however, OIMB's deadline to turn in primary ballots was the last day of University elections, and therefore, the primary results are final. Elections Board members said. OIMB failed to turn in ballots by the new deadline, they said.

Along with Washburn and Sunada and Scotten and Banfield, candidates for Student Senate and ASUO Programs Finance Committee seats will also advance to the general election.

In the primary elections, 13 Senate candidates won their seats outright to become Senators for the 1996-97 year. Mario Garza, candidate for PFC Seat 1, ran unopposed to become a member of next year's budget committee.

Students will choose between two final candidates for all other Senate and PFC seats during the general election, except for Academic Senator Seat 18.

No candidates were on the ballot for this position, and no write-in candidates acquired the seven necessary votes to be considered a true candidate. This vacancy will be filled by appointment of the ASUO Executive.

How students will vote in the general election for Programs Finance Senator Seat 1 will be decided when the ASUO Constitution Court reviews allegations that the Elections Board allowed a candidate for this seat to file for candidacy after the March 8, 5 p.m. deadline.

An injunction to the Elections Board instructing them to not release primary results for Seat 1 was filed Thursday afternoon by Don Scales, the chief justice of the Constitution Court.

Students also approved a ballot measure dealing with funding of student programs. This means that program budgets presented to students as ballot measures can exceed the 7 percent increase in program funding that the PFC set as a funding benchmark for groups this year.
