Journalism major to try for county commissioner

ELECTION: Dellinger has been a Lane County resident his entire life

A University undergraduate majoring in journalism and communications is running for Lane County Commissioner for the North Eugene district, which represents the Santa Clara and Bethel neighborhoods.

David W. Dellinger said he can offer common sense and problem solving skills to the board of commissioners based on his experience as a member of the community and as a member of his neighborhood.

"We're not getting a diversity of voices on our elected commissions whether it's the county commission or the city council," Dellinger said. "People are being appointed by the people that are already there, which isn't necessarily the viewpoints of the citizens."

He said he sees the need to represent the concerns of citizens living in the areas of the county that fall within the urban growth boundaries of Eugene and Springfield. People in these areas are

caught within the conflicts between city government and county government and often have no recourse for voicing their own special concerns.

Dellinger said he also shares the concerns of the community regarding stable funding for education.

"The best thing the county can do for the students is to provide the services necessary for the community as a whole, to provide stable funding for essential services and to provide quality services whether it's public safety, sanitation, roads, highways or public transportation," Dellinger said. "These are all the things that contribute to the quality of life in this area."

John McFadden, Richard Bowden and current Lane County Commissioner Bobby Green are also running for the north Eugene position.

A primary election will be May 21. There will be a run-off in November between the primary's top two vote-getters, unless one of the candidates in the primaries earns 50 percent of the votes.

Dellinger is a life-long resident of Lane County. He is currently completing a bachelor's degree in journalism.
