

Basketball: Student ticket numbers undetermined

"In order to recruit and develop the best athletes, we need the best facilities," he said.

Green said he would like to see students at the games but emphasized the fact that everybody in the room was ultimately on the same side.

"The enemy is Arizona and UCLA, it's not in this room," he said. "Somewhere there is a amiable solution."

Indeed, a solution was made but not without its difficulties. Once the discussion began, the 16 senators present weren't afraid to speak their minds on the issue.

Many senators stated immediately their unwillingness to comply with the proposal.

"The most important thing we need to do is preserve the seats on the court level because that's what students want," Senator Sean Martin said.

Some senators agreed with the motion, saying there really wasn't many other options.

"I think this is a very reasonable proposal," Senator Kalpana Krishnamurthy said. "Tell me how the Athletic Department is going to eat the cost once again."

Senate President Martin Fisher did bring up the possibility of putting the question to the students in the elections. However, as time wore on, many senators brought up the reality of writing a ballot measure before the polls opened in the morning and the possibility eventually faded away.

After two hours, the proposal was finally voted on by the Senate and passed 10-6. However, even after Fisher adjourned the meeting, many senators, including Martin and Andrew Parmentier, urged the rest of the Senate to stay and reconsider the decision.

Eventually, after a case was made for a new vote, Fisher called the meeting back into order. After nearly an hour of deliberation, the vote was upheld after Kelton, who only votes in case of a tie, broke an 8-8 tally.

The final amount of \$1,080,680 won't be the Senate's only mark on the battle, however. Kelton said next year's ASUO Executive will most likely use many of the ideas generated in the meetings in order to figure the details of the contract.

The Senate's role in the process though, after no lack of healthy discussion, is over.

"There's still a lot of options," Fisher said. "But it really isn't up to us to do anything about it."
