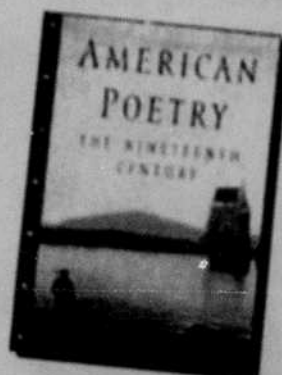

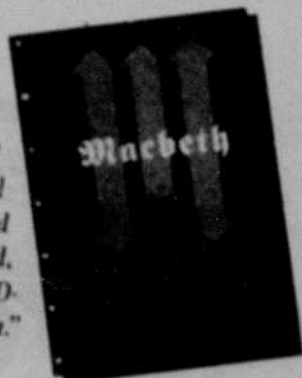

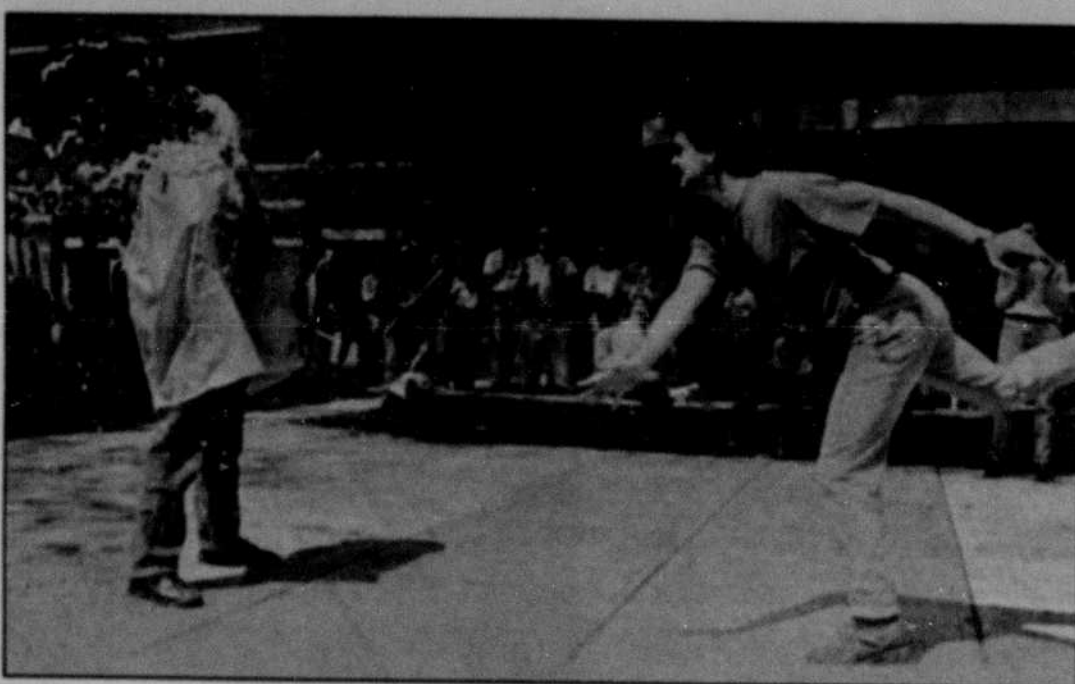

in the struggle between the work-

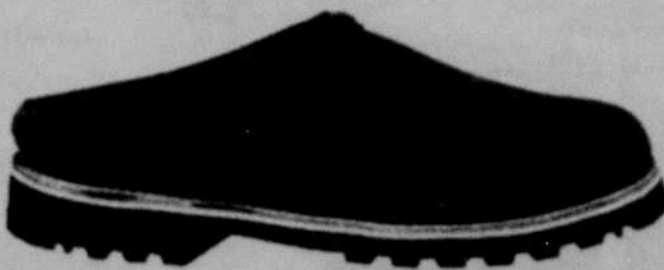
ing class and the capitalist minor-
