

Iverson to announce plans for next year

WASHINGTON (AP) — Allen Iverson is expected to disclose his NBA plans on Wednesday, and the Georgetown star is likely to become the first player in coach John Thompson's 24 years to leave early for the pros.

Iverson has two years of eligibility remaining. The university would not confirm his intentions, saying only that a news conference will be held "regarding Allen Iverson."

Iverson has been driving a \$130,000 Mercedes on loan from a dealer since early April, an apparent violation of NCAA rules that would come into play should he decide to return.

Three weeks ago, The Washington Post quoted unidentified sources as saying the All-American guard had decided to turn

pro.

Iverson, one of the nation's quickest players, averaged 24.7 points, 3.8 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 3.5 steals last season.

He was the Big East defensive player of the year for the second time.

Iverson, a football and basketball prep standout, nearly lost out on a college career.

In 1993, he and two friends were convicted in connection with a bowling alley brawl. Iverson was given a five-year sentence, of which he served four months.

He was then freed by Gov. L. Douglas Wilder on the condition that he complete his high school education.

Iverson was then recruited by Georgetown, where 72 of the 74 players who have stayed four years under Thompson have received their degrees.

Thompson, who is fiercely proud of the graduation rate, declared last month that Iverson would leave only with his permission — "or he will go nowhere."

Four Ducks placed on All-Pacific-10 team

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. — The Oregon women's tennis team placed four members on the All-Pacific-10 Conference North tennis squads, Pac-10 Commissioner Tom Hansen announced.

Caryn Coyle and Ali Napier were selected for the first team, and Elise Adams and Shanell Kaneshiro were named to the sec-

ond team.

Coyle, a sophomore, moved into Oregon's No. 1 position early in the year. She compiled a 10-7 record at the top spot and was an all-conference second team member last year.

Napier, a freshman native of Surrey, England, finished the season with the Ducks' best singles record at 18-9. She was also paired with Kaneshiro to make up the Ducks' top doubles team.

Adams, a senior from Lake Oswego, held down Oregon's No. 2 spot for most of the year, putting together a 6-11 record. The award is Adams' second all-conference nomination.

Kaneshiro, a freshman from Mililani, Hawaii, held the Ducks' second-best record at 14-8. She played at the No. 4 and 5 positions and was part of the No. 1 doubles team, where she and Napier collected a 7-10 record.
