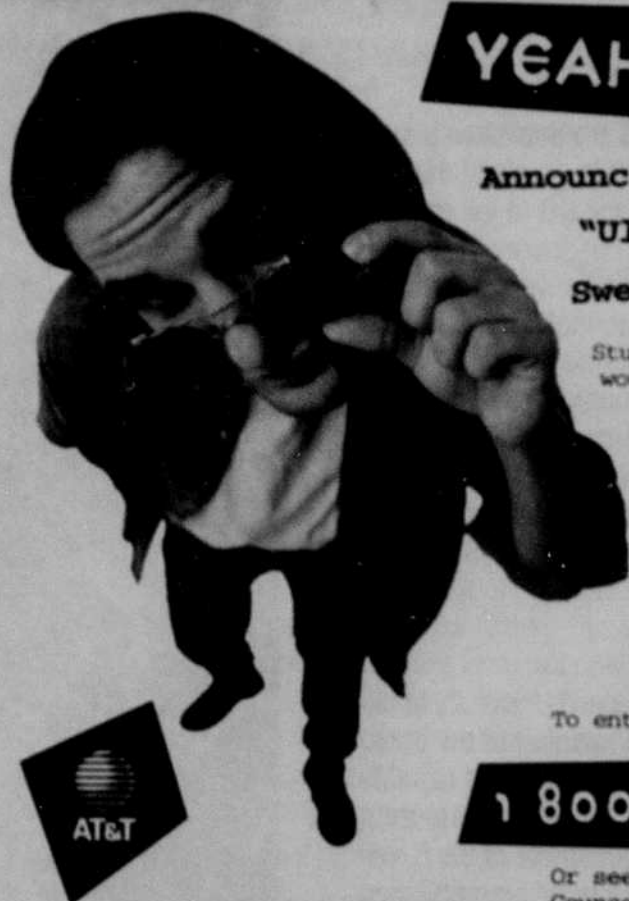

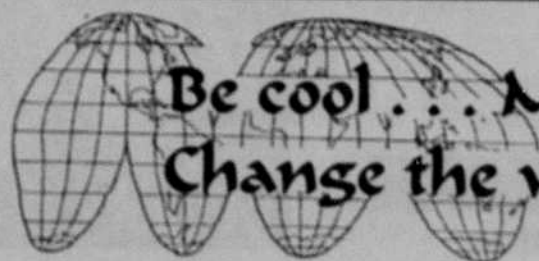

## Judge dismisses counts in Whitewater fraud trial

**CHARGES:** James McDougal insists his co-defendants are innocent

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP) — President Clinton's former Whitewater partner ran into tough questioning at his fraud trial Tuesday, denying he was involved in allegedly fraudulent loans despite a lengthening paper trail suggesting he knew about the deals.

Charged with 19 felonies and taking the stand in his own defense, James McDougal insisted he never met with then-Gov. Clinton in the mid-1980s about one of the transactions, a \$300,000 loan to a company controlled by McDougal's former wife that has never been repaid.

McDougal proclaimed the innocence of his co-defendants — his former wife, Susan, and Gov. Jim Guy Tucker — and McDougal offered to shoulder the blame for actions prosecutors are trying to pin on Susan McDougal.

Susan McDougal "never did anything illegal, immoral or unethical in her life," McDougal testified.

Tucker and the McDougal family were indicted in August on fraud and conspiracy charges for allegedly misusing \$3 million in federally backed loans obtained before Tucker became governor in 1992.

Clinton, subpoenaed by the McDougals, testified by videotape April 28. The tape is scheduled to be played once McDougal is off the stand.

On cross-examination, Whitewater prosecutor Ray Jahn confronted McDougal with memo after memo allegedly dictated by McDougal and relating to the loans at issue in the 10-week trial. The documents detail how the S&L's president, John Latham, was to handle the transactions.

McDougal contemptuously rejected Jahn's assertions, suggesting Jahn was reading too much into the memos. McDougal said that in many instances, he was simply passing along

loan terms to S&L executives that others had already agreed to. All the loans in question, stressed McDougal, were legitimate.

U.S. District Judge George Howard Jr. on Monday threw out four charges each against Tucker and Susan McDougal, leaving seven counts against the governor and four against McDougal's ex-wife. Howard left all 19 charges pending against McDougal.

The charges left against Susan McDougal all involve the \$300,000 loan to a company called Master Marketing. The government says the money should have gone toward business expenses but that part of it was used for personal and business debts and land purchases, including \$50,000 in payments for Whitewater property.

McDougal said he was responsible for the paperwork on the loan.

"If the jury believes she's done anything wrong, charge it to me," he said.

Former banker David Hale testified earlier in the trial that McDougal and Tucker schemed with him to generate loans to benefit themselves and their business partners.

The 55-year-old McDougal, who is in poor health, moved slowly to the witness stand and spoke in a subdued tone during nearly two hours of questioning.

"I had no loans to any political person," he testified. Of Tucker, he said, "He's done nothing illegal that I know of. We certainly didn't enter into a conspiracy."

McDougal made it clear he regards Hale — a disgraced municipal judge — as a liar and a forger who fabricated a story about meeting with Clinton at a McDougal real estate sales office to plot a fraudulent loan.

"Did you ever meet with David Hale and Bill Clinton at the Castle Grande sales office for the purpose of discussing a loan in the name of Susan McDougal?" McDougal's lawyer Sam Heuer asked.

"No sir," McDougal replied.
