Police arrest suspect, but come up short in sexual assault case

NORTHWEST
PORTLAND (AP) — Police have decided a man arrested in Clackamas County in a Tuesday night incident is not the serial rapist who has attacked seven Portland women since January.

Kevin Walls, 35, of Bend, resembled a composite sketch of the serial rapist but police ruled him out soon after his arrest. Walls was arraigned Wednesday on charges of rape, sodomy and burglary.

Tess Wisehart, who runs the Portland Women's Crisis Line, wondered if police were doing enough to catch the serial rapist.

Portland police have assigned a detective full time to the sexual assault case.

"We're doing everything except calling Dionne Warwick and the psychic friends," police spokesman Lt. C.W. Jensen said.

Decorated admiral commits suicide after medals questioned

WASHINGTON (AP) — The nation's top Navy officer, distraught after some of his military awards were called into question, died Thursday from an apparently self-inflicted gunshot wound.

Adm. Jeremy Boorda was to have met about the time of the shooting with the Washington bureau chief of Newsweek magazine, which was working on a story concerning his medals.

Administration officials, speaking on condition of anonymity, said there was no evidence the shooting was accidental and no suspicion of foul play. Two notes were found at Boorda's residence; they were sealed by investigating police.

Colleagues and lawmakers who had spoken with him in recent days expressed shock and dismay.

Arafat suffers stroke, officials claim it was 'stomach disorder'

JERUSALEM (AP) — An Israeli television station reported Thursday that Yasser Arafat suffered a mild stroke this week but added that the Palestinian Authority denied its leader had anything other than a bad flu.

Israel's Channel Two television said Arafat started feeling bad in Cairo on Sunday, after a meeting with Jordan's King Hussein and Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak.

A senior Jordanian official who attended the meeting said Arafat had a "stomach disorder."

The Channel Two report did not cite any sources and did not say on which day Arafat suffered the attack. No Palestinian officials could be immediately reached for comment on the report.

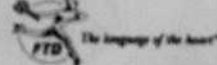
