On May 14 at about 5:45 p.m., four students said they witnessed Lee take negative fliers about himself out of public mailboxes in the ASUO office in Suite 4 of the EMU.

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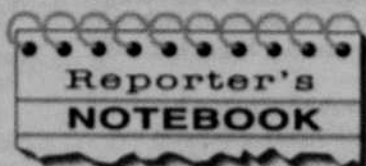
Women's self-defense class trains survivors, not victims

Defensive position. Fist. Strike! Defensive position. Sweep kick. Strike!

Officer Bob Guse repeated those words over and over again as I practiced throwing punches and kicks at an imaginary opponent. It felt like the tryouts for a new Karate Kid movie. But in the back of my mind I knew this was different. This was not a Hollywood movie, it was a fight for survival.

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Police search for rape suspect

■ **CRIME:** Kylee Brooks, arrested for sexual assault, has been missing since Friday afternoon

The Eugene Department of Public Safety is asking for assistance in locating Kylee Justin Brooks, who was arrested on charges of attempted rape, sodomy, sexual abuse and kidnap on May 12.

According to Eugene police, Brooks has been missing since Friday afternoon.

After his arrest last Sunday, Brooks was being held at the Lane County Jail on \$50,000 security. On the evening of May 14, he posted the 10 percent, or \$5000, necessary to be released.

Brooks, 23, is the main suspect in connection to an attempted rape reported by a 19-year-old University student who said

she was sexually assaulted in the Pioneer Cemetery by campus last Sunday.

Following a grand jury indictment, a Bench Warrant was issued for his arrest.

Since his release, Brooks has been seen in the Tigard area where his parents live. Brooks was a student at the University and is also the former president of Sigma Alpha Epsilon.

Brooks is aware that he is wanted.

The suspect is black, 6-feet tall, 160 pounds and has black hair and brown eyes. He drives a red 1983 Jeep Cherokee with Oregon license TAK 231.
