Controversy: A new board will decide future

More than 300 members, who were very tense and frustrated, took over the meeting and motioned for a recall of the three members who appointed Evangelista: Ross Freeman, Alison Halderman and Karine Homestead.

Before the vote for a recall, the three members were given a chance to speak on their behalf.

Alison Halderman, secretary for the board, said she would support diversifying programming and said she wanted to see her children get the same opportunity that she had.

Alluding to the rumors, Halderman said everyone should take every, "He, she or they said," with a grain of salt.

"I'm still puzzled as to why this is such a big deal," she said. "I voted what I know."

Karine Homestead said she hoped that some good would come out of all of this.

"We acted with integrity," Homestead said. "We had concerns and we tried to act on those concerns."

Ross Freeman, treasurer for the board, said he came to

Eugene as an advocate for restoration and he said he was hurt that people were hissing and ridiculing other people.

But the pleas went unheard; a strong majority of members voted to recall Freeman, Halderman and Homestead.

The future of the WOW Hall and the general manger lay in the hands of the new board, who was elected after *Emerald* press time Sunday night.

Steve Hangebrauk, vice chairman for the board, said it's a matter of how the new board of directors deals with the problems.

"No matter who the board is they will still have to deal with those same problems," Hangebrauk said. "Many people created a mountain out of a mole [hill]."

Evangelista said there was a lot of goodwill of the people, but there was a definite disagreement.

"That is the saddest part of all of this," he said. "There is a lot of misrepresentation of facts. People's hearts are being pitted against one another."

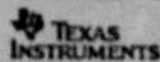
