**Oregon GOP chief  
says party ads caused  
lagging poll results**



SALEM (AP) — Poorly done ads produced by a national GOP committee could be a reason Republican Senate candidate Gordon Smith lags in a new poll, the head of the Oregon Republican Party said Wednesday.

Television ads produced by the National Senatorial Campaign Committee in Washington, D.C., that aired prior to the May 21 primary election were a "monumental mistake," said state GOP chief Randy Miller.

The advertisements attacked Democrat Tom Bruggere, saying the founder of Mentor Graphics in Wilsonville fired more than 500 employees from his computer software company while paying himself more than \$2 million.

A poll released Tuesday by Portland television station KPTV indicates Bruggere, a political newcomer who went on to win the Democratic primary, holds a 51-38 lead over Smith.

They are running for the seat held by veteran Republican Mark Hatfield, who retires in January.

Smith is state Senate president and narrowly lost a U.S. Senate race in January to Democrat Ron Wyden.

Miller said the anti-Bruggere ads were poorly constructed "and I told them so in Washington. They don't understand the political climate in Oregon."

Smith said he had nothing to do with the committee's ads. But he said he had little sway in the matter before the May 21 primary campaign was over.

While defending the ads, a spokesman for the national GOP committee said Wednesday that future tactics are now up to Smith.

**Beating victim seen  
arguing with man  
just prior to attack**



NEW YORK (AP) — An unidentified woman savagely beaten in Central Park was spotted having an angry confrontation with a young man at about the time of the attack, police said Wednesday.

Police received several tips and anonymous phone calls reporting the Tuesday afternoon argument, said Deputy Inspector Wayne Bax.

"We feel there are a number of witnesses out there who can not only identify the victim, but describe what happened," Bax said during a news conference. "We believe there was a confrontation which may have drawn people's attention."

One investigator, speaking on condition of anonymity, said police were preparing a sketch of the assailant and believe that the assailant knew the victim.

Investigators found "indication of a sexual attack," but the victim was not raped, Police Commissioner Howard Safir said. Safir said a team of 50 detectives will work on the case until all leads are exhausted.

"And right now there are many leads," he said.

Mayor Rudolph Giuliani also announced an \$11,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the assailant.

A passerby found the woman bleeding from the ears and unconscious shortly after 4 p.m. on a pathway about 100 feet inside the park at 82nd Street.

The woman was in critical condition Wednesday with severe head injuries that police believe were caused by a blunt object. No weapon was found.

**Thousands protest  
slaying of opposition  
leader Abiola's wife**



LAGOS, Nigeria (AP) — Thousands of university students marched through a western city on Wednesday to protest the fatal shooting of a wife of imprisoned opposition leader Moshood K. Abiola.

Armed police broke up the demonstration that began at the University of Ibadan in the city of the same name about 70 miles north of Lagos. The students met at the university gates and marched to the main marketplace where merchants joined in the protest.

The protesters blocked traffic, sang anti-military songs and carried placards that called on the United Nations to intervene and secure democracy for the West African nation.

Kudirat Abiola, 44, was in her car when she was shot at close range by six gunmen Tuesday morning. She died of her head wounds two hours later, as did her chauffeur.

Kudirat Abiola was buried Wednesday afternoon in her family compound in a Lagos suburb, about 3 miles from where she was killed. She was buried next to another of Abiola's three wives, who died of cancer in 1992. The couple had seven children; her husband has about 60 children from his three marriages and dozens of mistresses.

Kudirat Abiola had openly criticized the government of military ruler Gen. Sani Abacha. Her husband, a millionaire businessman who was widely believed to have won Nigeria's nullified 1993 presidential election, was jailed for treason in 1994 after he proclaimed himself president. Ibadan was one of his bases of support.
