Distinguished Oregonians receive prestigious award

Several members of the community will be recognized for their contributions to the area

Two prominent Oregon music directors and an Oregon businesswoman will receive Distinguished Service Awards from University faculty for their contributions and service to the Eugene community at the spring commencement ceremonies.

The honorees of the 1996 Distinguished Service Awards are Marin Alsop, music director of the Eugene Symphony since 1989, Royce Saltzman, co-founder and former executive director of the Oregon Bach Festival, and Jean Tate, who founded a Eugene realty firm.

The Distinguished Service Award is one of the highest honors given by University faculty. Honorees are chosen for their significant contributions to the cultural development of Oregon through their knowledge and skills, said David Hubin, executive assistant to the president.

"The award is an attempt by the University to honor excellence in society," Hubin said.

The University solicits nominations from community organi-

zations and University faculty during fall term of each year. About 30 nominees were formally submitted to the University Senate for approval this year.

Tate is founder of the Jean Tate Real Estate, Inc., one of the most successful and largest real estate firms in the Eugene area. She has also volunteered for more than a dozen civic task forces, political groups and human rights causes. She has been heavily involved in fund raising for low income housing. Currently, she is working with an organization developing Wood Leaf Village, an affordable housing complex in South-East Eugene for which she was able to raise \$3,775,000 grant.

When Alsop took on the music conductor's post for the Eugene symphony, she became the only woman in the world to hold such a high position. She has since left the post and now lives on the east coast, where she directs the Long Island Philharmonic.

Saltzman is a University professor emeritus who helped form the Oregon Bach Festival, an internationally renowned music festival that takes place every summer in Eugene, and has been involved in its growth for the past 26 years. The festival now includes more than 50 concerts, dozens of master classes, and guest performers from some of the best concert halls in the world.
