

Professional schools to host individual grad ceremonies

Several private commencement ceremonies will follow the general graduation

In addition to the large graduation ceremony June 15, smaller ones will take place for affiliated departments to hand out degrees and recognize outstanding graduates.

Among these departments will be the School of Architecture and Allied Arts, the Charles H. Lundquist College of Business, and the School of Journalism and Communication. These schools use these private ceremonies to honor their graduates.

The School of Architecture and Allied Arts will have its ceremony at 3 p.m. on the EMU lawn. A brass quintet will serenade the estimated 250 graduates and 1500 audience members, who will eagerly await the presentation of degrees.

Robert Melnick, the new dean of the school, will welcome the students as well as act as guest speaker. Department heads will hand out awards to outstanding students.

After the degrees are presented, a reception will take place for the graduates and their guests in the courtyard at Lawrence Hall.

The Charles H. Lundquist College of Business will host its ceremony at 3 p.m. on the south lawn of the Knight Library. If it rains, the ceremony will be moved to the Hilton Hotel.

Awards for outstanding teachers and GTFs will be among

those presented by the College of Business. The awards were voted on by students.

In addition, "we recognize graduates who are being inducted into the business honorary," said Don Lytle, director of the undergraduate programs. But this ceremony will be less formal than others.

"We're relaxed and laid back," Lytle said. The students will introduce themselves when presented with their degrees.

"It's better than a lot of names being mispronounced," Lytle said.

One school will not have its ceremony June 15. Because law students' academic year is divided into semesters rather than trimesters, the students' year begins in August and ends in May. The School of Law had its commencement May 15 at the Hult Center.

The School of Journalism and Communication is hosting its ceremony at 10 a.m. on the south lawn of the Knight Library.

If the weather is inclement, the ceremony will occur in the South Eugene High School Auditorium.

Instead of a brass band, journalism and communication graduates will listen to bagpipe music. This is a tradition, according to Assistant Dean Greg Kerber, who said that they've had the unusual music for several years.

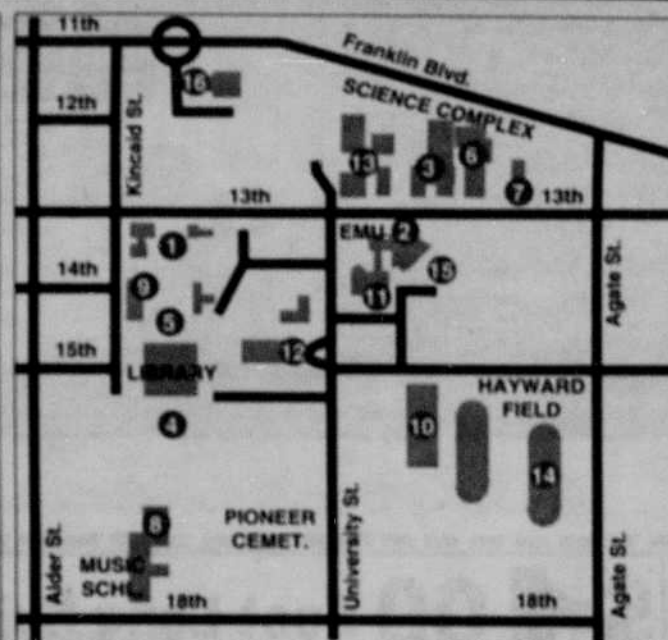
There will be a number of awards given, including best male and female graduates, best magazine student, and advertising and teaching awards.

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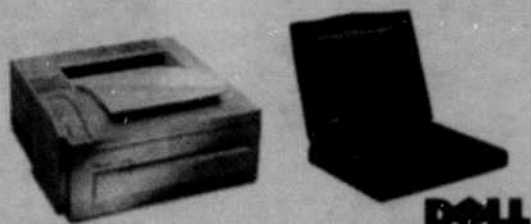
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
