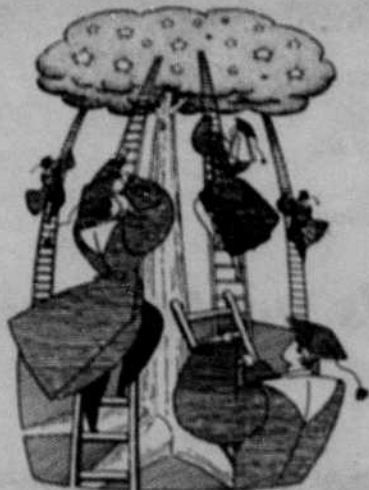

lead.

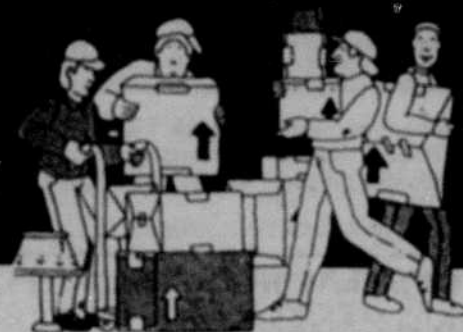
Stand outside the EMU at noon and listen to the "clock" chime "Mighty-O."

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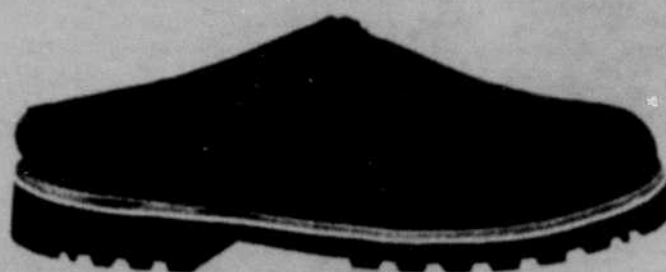


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
