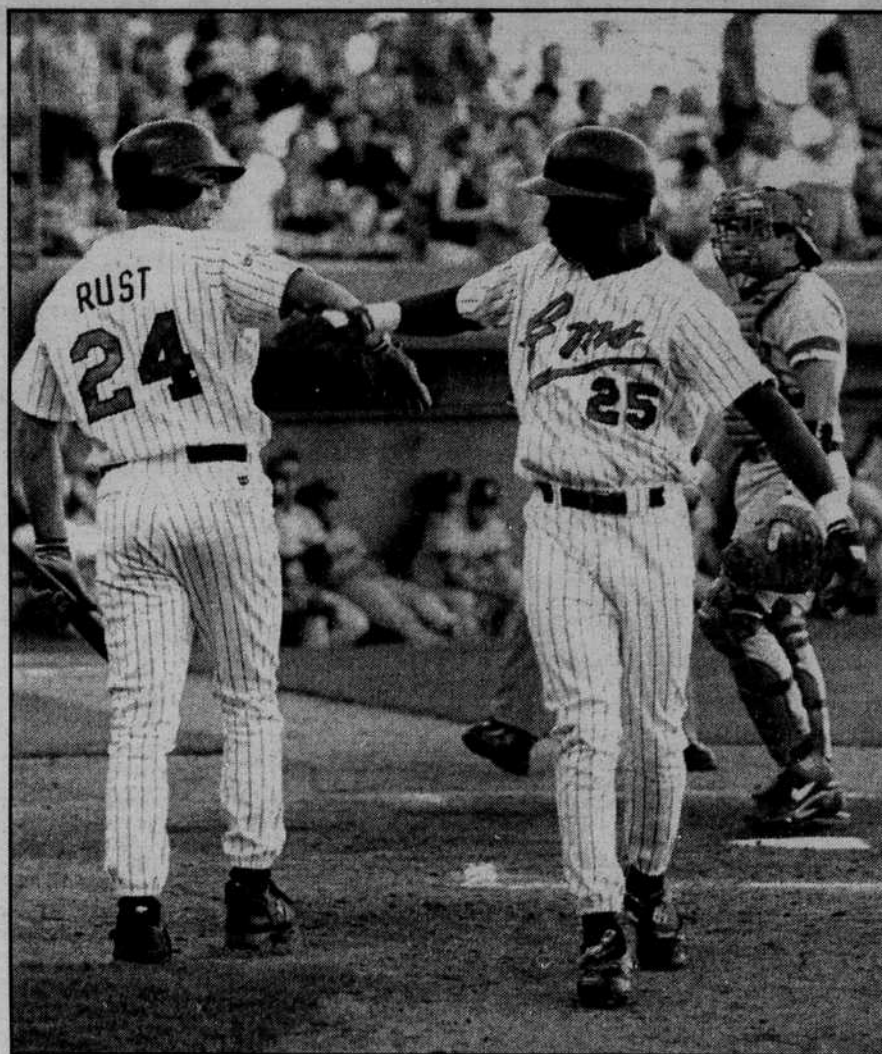

Baseball: Strong pitching instrumental

The Ems jumped on Hueston early, scoring the first two runs in the second inning on Rust's two-run smash that scored Pointer, who had singled to lead-off the inning.

With a 2-0 cushion to work with, Ems' starting pitcher Odalis Perez was sensational. He kept the Indians at bay with an array of pitches, striking out nine in three and two-thirds innings, including a streak of six in a row at one point.

"He was mixing it up real well — fastball, change-up, curveball," said Ems catcher Dax Norris.

Norris provided the drama for the evening in the fourth inning, when he had his hand stepped on by Indian first baseman Kit Pellow. Norris was diving head-long into firstbase on a pick-off move by Hueston. Pellow tumbled on

top of Norris, inadvertently stepping on his hand.

"They tried to back pick me and he stepped on my hand," said a worn-out looking Norris, whose night also included scrambling for countless balls in the dirt behind homeplate and taking a few foul balls of his catchers' mask. "I feel like going home and getting into bed right now."

The Indians were able to muster one run off Perez in the fourth, but the Ems got it right back in the bottom half of the inning when Pointer led off with his solo shot to center to give the Ems a 3-1 lead.

The Indians, with a little firepower in their bats also, bridged the gap with a solo home run in the sixth from designated hitter Tony Miranda, and then tied the game in the seventh when Kendrick Moore scored from

third on a groundout by Kristopher Didion.

But the Ems bats were just too hot. Hines crushed a pitched, sending the ball over the leftfield wall and winning a lucky fan \$700 in the process. Two batters later, Johnson went the other way, hitting his solo shot over the right-field wall. Arnold added his in the eighth.

P.K. Koehler and Mike Jones came in to relieve Perez, each pitching a solid game, with Jones collecting his third win.

"We have a great pitching staff," claimed Norris. "It is a young pitching staff, but they do a real good job. A lot of them can throw two [or] three pitches for strikes and that is what you have got to have to be successful. If we supply the offense, we will keep them in the game. We are just happy to be home."
