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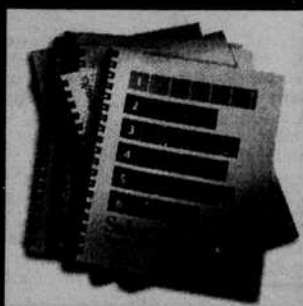
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**Washington single-
game tickets excluded
from opening sales**

Seats for the Oregon football team's Oct. 26 game against Washington will not be available for purchase until a later date, even though all other game tickets are on sale now, according to Athletics Director Bill Moos.

Due to the record-setting season-ticket sales encountered following the school's consecutive New Year's Day bowl appearances as well as single-game orders placed by season-ticket holders and Oregon Alumni Association members for the interstate rivalry in Autzen Stadium, it is projected the contest will easily become Oregon's earliest sellout ever.

"This demand from our season-ticket holders has reached an all-time high but it certainly is a good problem to have to encounter. We can still assure anyone who wants to attend the Oregon-Washington game of doing so through the purchase of season tickets but we feel it is better not to accept single-game orders for this game rather than have to refund money at a later date for orders we are unable to fill," Moos said.

Single-game reserved tickets for each of the Ducks' remaining five home games went on sale Monday at the Casanova Center ticket office as well as all Ticket Master outlets throughout Oregon and Washington. Included in on-going ticket sales are approximately 2,000 standing room tickets for the Washington game with admission for adults costing \$18 and children and seniors \$9.

Over 26,000 of Autzen Stadium's 41,698 seats have been allocated on a season basis to Duck Athletic Fund members, alumni, the general public, students and faculty with an additional 4,000 individual tickets provided to the University of Washington in accordance with the standard contract between the two schools. Moos said that Washington had requested 6,000 tickets for its distribution but only would be provided the same number that Oregon received for last year's game in Seattle.

The contest has been a sellout each of the last six times the two teams have met in Eugene dating back to 1983. In addition, Washington has provided the opposition for seven of the Ducks' top 17 crowds of all time since Autzen Stadium opened in 1967.

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**Oregon signs five
wrestlers**

The Oregon wrestling team signed five wrestlers to national letters of intent within the past four weeks, coach Ron Finley announced on Monday. Two of the wrestlers are college transfers and the others recently completed standout high school careers.

Heading the list is Jake Sellers, a 158-pounder from Reno, Nev., who claimed four state championships and was named an All-American by Amateur Wrestling News while competing for Wooster High School from 1992-95. Sellers is a transfer from Carroll College in Montana where he played football last season.

The Ducks also signed Jeremy Presta, a 134-42 lb. grappler from Missoula, Mont., who won the 1996 state championship as a senior. Presta is a four-time prep state placer, a three-time finalist, and an Amateur Wrestling News All-American who placed third at the National High School Championships.

Shawn O'Rourke of La Grande, considered the sleeper of the recruiting class by Finley, was a three-time state placer. Like Sellers, O'Rourke will wrestle at 158 lbs. while at Oregon.

Oregon signed a local product in 126-pounder Jesse Meyer of Cottage Grove. Meyer placed third at the 4A state championships for the Lions last winter.

Chale Sonnen, a sophomore transfer from Brigham Young who placed third at the University National Greco-Roman Championships in the spring, has also signed with Oregon. A native of West Linn, Sonnen will likely compete at 177 lbs.

The signings conclude a solid recruiting period for the Ducks, who previously signed standouts Doug Lee of Central Point and Mike Mondt of Auburn, Wash. Lee is a two-time state champion from Crater High School at 177 lbs. and Mondt is a 1996 Washington prep state champion at heavy-weight.

"We've really filled in at the upper weights where we've needed some help, especially at 158 where we ended up recruiting two outstanding athletes, Jake Sellers and Shawn O'Rourke," Finley said.



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
