Activists won't celebrate Salvage Rider's birthday

■ **PROTEST:** People will gather this weekend in response to the anniversary of the controversial law

Salvage Rider opponents won't be singing "Happy Birthday" this weekend.

But more than 1000 people are expected to gather this weekend to commemorate the one-year anniversary of President Clinton's signing of the controversial law.

The protest comes in the wake of the July 2 directive from the Secretary of Agriculture that some logging sales should be held up.

"I want to get people together at this rally and make a connection," Steve Connelly, a University graduate student in environmental studies, said. "There is a whole wide variety of people that oppose the Salvage Rider."

Protesters will also gather to support the efforts of environmentalists at Warner Creek. The activists have been camped out for a year in protest of old growth logging methods.

"I've been really inspired by them," Connelly said. "They're to the bone and very committed. Although theirs is not the

This weekend's events have been designed to accomplish a couple different things, Connelly said.

"We've got two main goals," he said. "First, we want to make the Forest Service aware that a large and diverse group of citizens is unhappy with their failure to obey the Secretary of Agriculture's directive."

"Second, we want to form an explicit coalition between diverse groups."

The Salvage Rider protest will take place throughout the weekend, Connelly said. Activities will include speakers, music, information sharing and an all-night vigil and camp out.

Spring term dean's list posted

Almost one in every 10 University students has something new to put on his or her resume.

During spring term of 1996, 1,149 students earned their way onto the dean's list. These students had to meet a number of requirements, including a GPA of at least 3.75. Students also had to carry 12 or more graded credits throughout the term in order to make the list.

All undergraduate, postbaccalaureate and National Student Exchange students were eligible. The dean's list for scholastic achievement is not open to graduate students.

The number of students who made the list spring term were fewer than the 1,172 who made it in fall term of 1995 and the 1,193 students who were listed in winter term of 1996. Approximately 9.5% of the 12,129 eligible students at the University earned a place on the list for spring term.

The dean's list is a way of acknowledging students' efforts and achievements, Dean of Student Life Weston Morrill said. Those students who make the list receive notification with their grades.

"It's certainly something prospective employers find of interest," he said.

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
