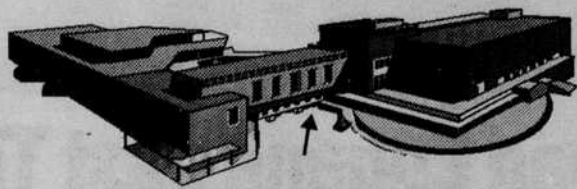

Belden to sit out 1996 season

Oregon football place kicker Matt Belden is expected to miss the entire 1996 season while recovering from complications associated with a torn quadriceps from last fall's season opener, according to head coach Mike Bellotti.

Belden suffered the injury to his right leg during a second-quarter kickoff in last year's 27-20 victory at Utah and was unable to return for the remainder of the season. Before succumbing to the injury, Belden was able to convert both extra point opportunities, a 25-yard field goal and one punt for 39 yards a year ago.

As a first-year freshman in 1994, Belden led the Ducks in scoring with 76 points, was successful on 13 of 23 field goal tries and averaged 39.8 yards on 81 punts. In addition, he was the co-recipent of the team's Gordon

Wilson Award, given to the program's top special teams performer, as well as honored as the Pacific-10 Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week on two occasions.

Oregon successfully petitioned the NCAA for a hardship ruling to restore Belden's year of eligibility following last season. He entered the upcoming campaign with only three seasons to complete his final three years of his collegiate career and would be left with only two years of eligibility should he be unable to return in 1996.

Belden indicated he would remain in Eugene and attend classes at Oregon while continuing his rehabilitation in hopes of resuming his career at a later date.

The two home run pitches were the only mistakes that O'Dell made all night. For most of the game he kept the Ems hitters at bay, striking out nine in five innings.

The Ems went with Bruce Chen to start the game and switched to Odalis Perez in the third and fourth innings. Both pitchers are being slowly worked back into the rotation after injuries and are on a strict pitch count. Chen's limit was 45 pitches while Perez, who was credited with the win, was held to 30.

"The next time out Chen can throw 50-60 pitches and we can increase Perez to 45 pitches," said Saul.

Both made good work of their limited time on the mound, with Chen giving up the only run between them on Rondon's home run.

Mike Jones pitched the Ems into the eighth, striking out five in just over three innings of work be-

fore yielding to Jason Flach who came in and got his fourth save of the year.

"I can't say enough about Flach," praised Saul of his closer. "He comes in and does an outstanding job."

The Ems played outstanding defense, twice picking off runners attempting to steal. Mark DeRosa made the defensive play of the night when the shortstop made a diving catch in shallow left field. DeRosa left his feet and was about four feet high, parallel to the ground, robbing Justin Bowles of a base hit.

"Mark DeRosa made an unbelievable play," said Johnson. "It was just awesome to watch."

Johnson was equally impressed with the performance of the pitchers.

"Our pitching staff did a great job tonight holding them to two runs," he said. "When our pitchers throw like that we can win any ballgame. With this squad we've got, there is no pressure to perform."
