United Way closes in on goal

■ **FUNDS:** Community members and businesses earn recognition for contributions to Lane County agency

United Way of Lane County is making headway on its fund-raising goal for this year, said Margaret Nichols, volunteer campaign chairwoman.

United Way hopes to raise more than \$2.7 million this year and has already received \$259,721 toward that goal.

"We are very pleased with our early momentum," Nichols said. "It strongly suggests we are also on track toward meeting our other goal of gaining 1,965 new donors."

United Way uses the funds to provide food, health care and shelter to needy Lane County families.

Donations have been coming from individuals, corporations and employee campaigns.

Corporations including Harry

Ritchie's Jewelers, Meier & Frank, WalMart and Xerox donated \$32,375 to United Way last week. U.S. Bank was the largest corporate contributor, donating \$27,825.

Employee campaigns garnered \$4,349 for the local charity last week. Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Oregon employees donated the largest amount — \$1,219.

Philanthropists who give more than a certain amount to United Way are honored in the Leadership Giving Circle and the Alexis de Tocqueville Society.

The Leadership Giving Circle is for individuals who give personal gifts of \$1,000 or more. Last year, the 200 members gave \$365,000. This year's circle goal is to raise \$435,000, said Paul Plath, volunteer chairman of Leadership Giving.

The Alexis de Tocqueville Society honors those who give an annual gift of \$10,000 or more. This year's members include John and Willa Avord, Marian Friestad and Peter Wright.

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
