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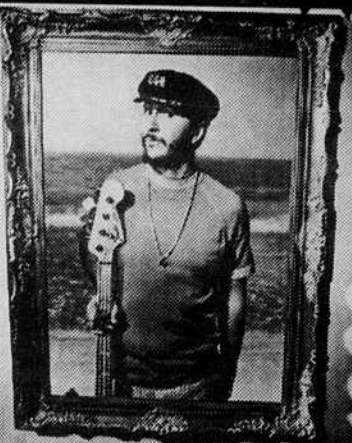
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Volunteers tidy up community

■ **CLEAN-UP:** Saturday's work was just the start of an on-going project to revive the West University district

The West University area got a face lift from about 70 University and community members on Saturday.

Volunteers banded together to clean up the various garbage and graffiti that has built up in the area.

Clean-up projects included cleaning the layers of posters off area telephone poles, removing graffiti from newspaper racks and buildings in the area, raking leaves, picking up litter and landscaping the area with flowers.

"Everyone in this community just turned out and said 'We want to help,'" said Cindy Ryan, community service and public relations chairwoman for Greek Life.

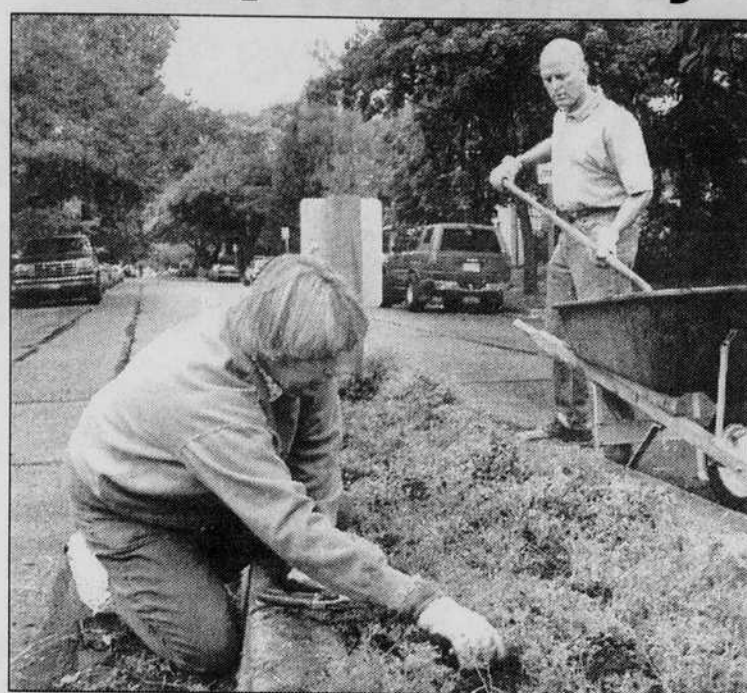
Volunteers worked on assigned projects for a few hours at a time.

"It looks a lot better," said Kappa Alpha Theta member Kandi Ogden.

The project was more than just a one-day attempt to improve the neighborhood. Organizers said it is an on-going attempt to revitalize the West University area.

"[Community members] see the need and importance," community volunteer Susan Trafton said.

Bill Washburn, student coordinator of the clean-up project, said he came together with local

churches and non-profit organizations, the Eugene Chamber of Commerce and small business associates to put out a report that would identify what needed to be done to improve the area.

The West University *Scopes Report* outlines the problems of the community and lists ways to change them.

"There are a whole host of long-term strategies," Washburn said of the project, which may take as many as 10 years to complete.

The project will include district improvements and an effort to get

property owners in the area to care about the community, Washburn said.

"[During] the last three-and-a-half months, we pulled our resources together," he said. "[We thought] 'How do we bring everyone together to improve this community?'"

However, only about one-third of the people living in the West University area own their property, Ryan said.

"If they get a better sense of ownership, then they're more apt to care," she said.

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
