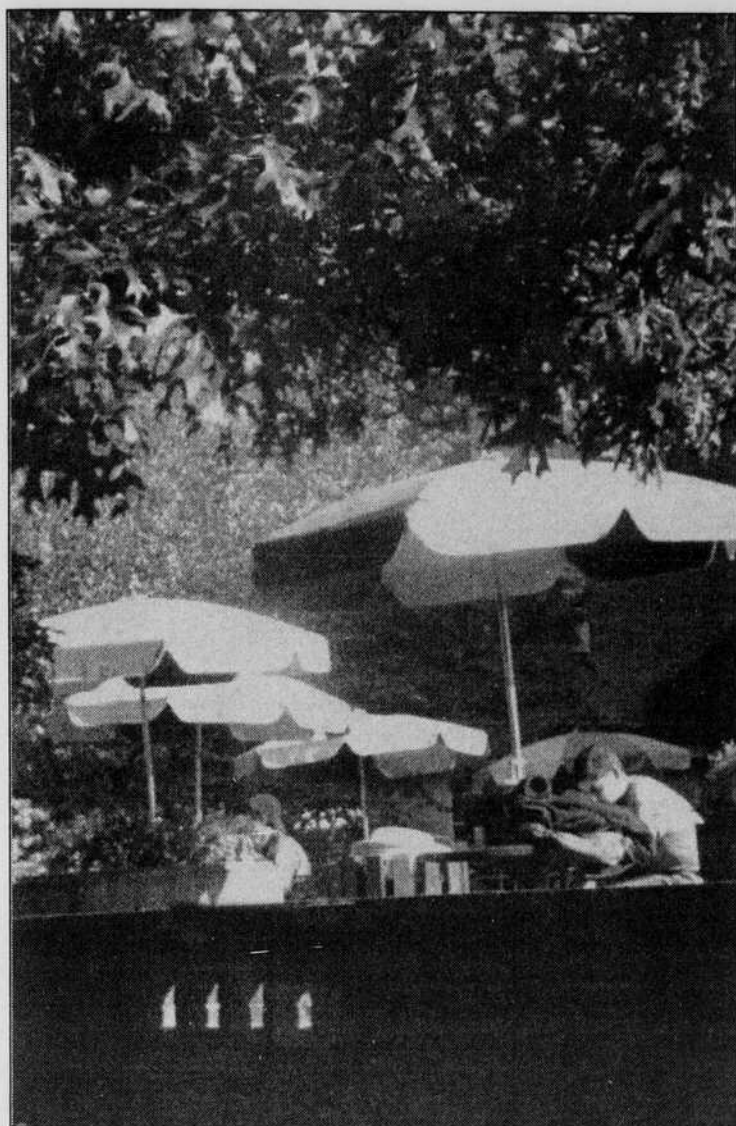




Students enjoy the autumn sunshine beneath a red Scarlet Oak tree outside the EMU. Oaks are common along the streets of campus.

tinct and was only seen in fossils. The needle-like leaves of the Dawn Redwood turn a reddish brown before falling off the branches, leaving the familiar conifer shape bare. Examples on campus are next to Cascade Hall near the Science Library, near the Pioneer Mother and just north of Villard Hall.

One way to see the fall foliage is to walk down 13th Avenue to Fenton Hall. In front of Fenton, near the Pioneer statue, is a large Scarlet Maple. Also along 13th Avenue are Big Leaf Maples. To the left of the Fenton's main door is a bright red Sargent Cherry. Between Fenton and Gilbert Halls is a large Yel-

low Wood that has golden leaves.

Another area to see the color on campus is near the Memorial Quadrangle between Gilbert Hall and Knight Library. There are Maples in front of the Lundquist College of Business, while English Oaks line the quad in front of the Museum of Art. On the Kincaid Street side of Prince Lucien Campbell are more Maples.

Landscape Architecture Professor Ann said, "The campus is an arboretum, a wonderful collection of trees from all over the world." Because of that, University students have a wonderful opportunity to see beautiful trees that are hard to find anywhere else in Oregon.

SOME MORE COLORFUL LEAVES

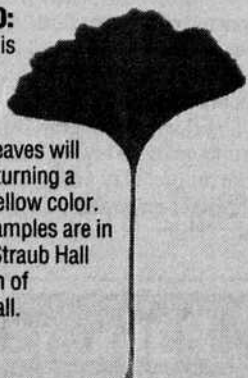
■ HORNBEAM:

A common tree on campus, this tree is often used as a street tree. As a native of Europe, its leaves turn a coppery-brown in the fall. Good examples are in the EMU courtyard.



■ GINKGO:

This tree is a native of China. Its fan-shaped leaves will soon be turning a golden yellow color. Good examples are in front of Straub Hall and north of Villard Hall.



■ JAPANESE MAPLE:

One of the most distinctive of the Maple family, this tree is usually small with many toothed lobes. Often a deep red color, this tree is often used as an ornamental tree. Good examples are in front of the Collier House and Johnson Hall.



■ YELLOW WOOD:

This leaf is long and slender with a beautiful golden color in the fall. A native of the Southeast, this tree is rare in the wild. A good example is between Fenton and Gilbert Halls.

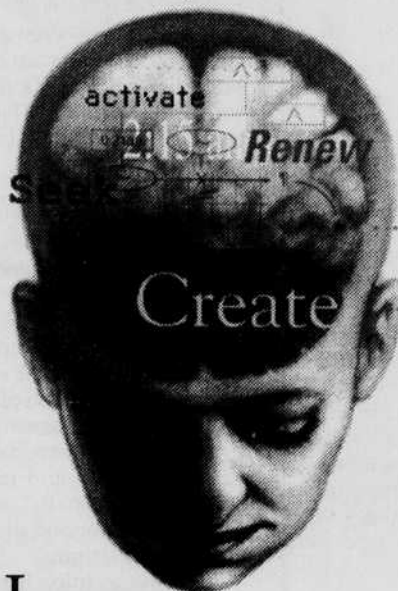
