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gram closures or tuition increases.

"Not only are program closures not on the horizon, we need to selectively look at new programs for our students," he said. "We must be prepared to serve students with high-quality programs they and the state need."

Tuition costs for both Oregon and out-of-state residents are at or near a maximum level, and hikes are not likely, Moseley said.

"I don't think there's any real flexibility there right now," he said. "And I hope we can get the Legislature to understand that."

Since Ballot Measure 5, a similar property tax measure passed in 1990, public college and university tuition has increased by more than 80 percent.

"The University responded to the challenges of Ballot Measure 5 in a remarkably productive way," Moseley said. "The University continues to be excellent even with the strains of Ballot Measure 5."

Other topics the University Senate discussed included the use of the \$15 million gift from Nike owner, Phil Knight.

Senators also reviewed the status of tenure at public universities and potential implications for the University.
