

## Funding: Council asks for new code

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After her motion to have the committee draft an interim housing ordinance failed, Keller made a motion to disband the Department Advisory Committee because she said the future council would not take action on the housing problems either.

"Once again in two years we haven't done any-

thing," she said. "I have absolutely no hope that the new council will take action since the two outgoing councilors [Councilor Shawn Boles and Keller] were the only ones who voted for this."

The motion to disband the committee failed and the council asked the committee to present to council an adapted code at a later council meeting.

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to write the names of those — both living and deceased — who have struggled with the AIDS virus, Dochnahl said.

Student Health Center literature encourages University students to take responsibility for curbing the

spread of HIV in their own lives. Confidential, anonymous HIV testing is available at the health center for \$12.

Health Center representatives said they advocate an active approach for everyone in stopping AIDS. Suggestions include testing,

volunteering at a local hospice and getting acquainted with someone who is HIV positive.

"Educators at the tables this year are working to encourage more action as well as increasing awareness," Dochnahl said.

The ASUO Student Senate tabled a motion to approve funding for a power macintosh, keyboard, software and printer for University magazine *Oregon Voice*. The magazine requested \$2,756 to replace and upgrade computer materials stolen from the office Spring quarter.

Senators questioned why no formal report of theft was recorded with the police or Oregon Public Safety. *Oregon Voice* suspects that the door was left ajar the

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night the keyboard and computer were stolen. The Senate tabled the \$1,565 cost of the keyboard and power mac to the Jan. 8th meeting.
