

Name of deceased UO student released

Police released the name Monday of the University student whose body was discovered Friday.

Jared Lee Holland was found by his father after his father had not been able to reach him, said Office of Public Safety Sgt. Dave Poppe. He had apparently hanged himself in his apartment, Poppe said.

Holland was 23 and a political

science major.

Although he had made some depressed comments to his roommate, police said there had been no clear indication Holland was depressed. Police have not found a suicide note, Poppe said.

Two other suicides were discovered Friday in Eugene, although police said the cases did not seem connected. The other

two cases were probably linked to the holidays, said Public Information Officer Jan Power.

Cases of depression usually increase during the holiday season, said Carolin Keutzer, the training director for the University's Counseling Center. However, suicides do not increase because of this.

The counseling center offers free drop-in counseling every day, Keutzer. The center will also be open through winter break, she said.

In addition, people needing immediate advice can call a crisis line at 346-4488.

■ The Office of Public Safety is still investigating a Burglary and Attempted Sex Abuse that occurred on Nov. 27. A woman student was awakened in her third-floor McAllister residence hall room by a stranger running his hand up her thigh. The door to the room had been closed but not locked. The man, who has not been identified, said his name was "Jonathon Carroway" or "Cathaway." Police have been unable to find anyone with that name. When the student asked the man to leave, he did so calmly and apologized. The woman said he seemed "very slow," but could not identify any mental problem. Nobody claims to know anyone matching the man's description.

■ Eight bicycle thefts were reported to OPS in the last week. The values of the bikes ranged from \$35 to \$335. Most were taken from class buildings, residence halls and apartments. OPS has not been able to identify a pattern in the thefts, which occurred at all hours of the day and at different places.

■ Two tables were stolen from study lounges in the University Inn sometime between Nov. 20 and 21. One table was taken from the sixth floor lounge and one from the seventh floor lounge. The tables had not been recovered, although notices were posted.

■ A janitor found a piece of paper that had been burned in a bathroom stall in Tingle residence hall on Nov. 23. Although there was no damage, the fire was listed as Arson 1 because it was a fire and could have become serious.

■ A student left a backpack unattended in the Knight Library on Nov. 25 and returned to find it had been stolen. The backpack contained about \$675 in property, including the student's keys. Theft like this from the library are becoming common, OPS said.

■ A Datsun valued at \$4,000 was recovered on Dec. 1 after it had been reported stolen. An officer walking by a parking lot at 1460 E. 18th Ave. spotted the car.
