

Killing: Society seen reflected in massacre

tion to brutality against women is not forgotten, Frahs said. In addition, the massacre is viewed as a reflection of society's views by many who commemorate it.

"The event is not an isolated act," Frahs said. "Though it's portrayed that way, it is a reflection of anti-feminist sentiments taken to extremes."

The video highlights this approach to the massacre, with journalists commenting on how media coverage recognized this as an isolated incident.

Females from the University of Montreal comment on the aftershock of the massacre, and one woman said, "The massacre is a magnification of what is happening to women all the time."

Jefferson: School's Asian Studies program will benefit

make it imperative for young people to become more knowledgeable about the rapid and dynamic changes taking place there," Fry said.

The focus of the program is on teacher training. University faculty have introduced Asian culture to teachers at Jefferson through a series of workshops and field trips.

Denes said the training is designed to "give teachers an opportunity to have exposure to some University faculty experts on Asia, so they can shape their own curriculums."

Teachers at Jefferson, through exposure in the workshops, field trips and access to lesson plans from a World Wide Web site, called Ask Asia, will be able to make their own decisions on what to integrate into the classroom.

"Because the teachers teach a variety of subjects, they need to have a wide range of material to choose from, so their goal is to have a range of possible activities for the classroom," Denes said.

Bolden said faculty at Jefferson have been extremely positive regarding the Bridge Asia project, because most of the grants focus

on a product that must be complete by a certain time and not staff development.

He said development is a key part of the project.

"I think the main unique part is for teachers to learn from experts," Bolden said. He said teachers receive the proper amount of release time to effectively implement the project.

Another component is to put teachers' curriculum, ideas and materials on a Web site. The school will share information with the other four schools in the nation selected for the grant.

"Hopefully people can come together and pool their resources," Denes said.

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
