community," she said.

A bit of humor is also in the display, McDermott said.

"The three French hens are sitting on the Eiffel Tower, and the four calling birds are sitting next to a telephone," she said.

To capture the holiday spirit, sheet music of "The Twelve Days of Christmas" is given to each car so people may sing along as they tour the display.

The fee is \$7 for cars; \$12 for vans holding seven or more people; \$24 for mini-busses holding 15 to 25 people; \$40 for busses; and \$3 per bike. Walk-through is not permitted.

Discount coupons are available at Bi-Mart stores and Burger King locations in Eugene, Springfield and Cottage Grove.

The Celebration of Lights is presented by PeaceHealth and sponsored in part by Pepsi-Cola Bottling Co. of Eugene. All profits from the event will help fund school-based health centers and music programs.

Orchard Point Park will be lit up in "splendor and grace" as it hosts The Festival of Lights from

Dec. 13 to 19.

"We want to see a break in the winter, to have people be bright and happy," said Rock Hastings, who is owner and operator of Orchard Point Concessions with his wife, Sharon Hastings.

Open 5 to 10 p.m. every night, the park will have more than 50 trees lit. School choirs and caroling groups will be providing entertainment, and Santa will be available for pictures.

The Mahayni Family Caroling Group, performing 7:30 to 8 p.m. on Dec. 13; and the Danaboe Grade School Choir, performing at 7 to 7:30 p.m. on Dec. 13 and 7 to 7:30 p.m. on Dec. 18, are the major entertainment highlights, Rock Hastings said.

Tickets are \$5 per family and \$2 per person. All money collected at the entrance will go to area Lions Clubs.

Beginning Dec. 17, Lane Transit District will ship 76 bus loads of people around the Eugene and Springfield area to enjoy holiday lights.

In its ninth annual year, the bus tours will run Dec. 17 to 18 at 6:30 p.m. and 8 p.m. and Dec. 20 to 22 at 6 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

Both bus tours will pick up people at Valley River Center and go through area neighborhoods with holiday light displays.

Highlights of the Eugene tour, said Michael Shoemacher, marketing representative of LTD, include visiting The Celebration of Lights at the Lane County Fairgrounds and viewing a live Nativity scene at 23rd Avenue and Friendly Street.

Though the Nativity scene is supposed to be still, that's not always the case.

"The sheep wag their tails a little," Shoemacher said.

One of the "magical" parts of the ride, Shoemacher said, is Springfield High School choir students leading people on a sing-along during the quiet parts of the ride.

"Everybody has a fun time," he said. "I've seen people get off the bus and give them [the choir students] hugs."

Tickets are available at Valley River Center, but they're almost sold out, Shoemacher said.

"It sells out right away; the community loves it," he said. "There's not enough tickets to go around."
