Bakery thrift store offers tasty bargains

Anyone who once lived in Bean Complex or has ever been near it has experienced the heavenly smell of fresh bread emanating from the Williams Bakery located next to campus. Possibly one of the few positive aspects of living in Bean Complex, Williams Bakery sends the pleasant scent of baking bread wafting through the dorms on a daily basis.

Fresh bread, along with plenty of day-old bargains, is also available right next to campus at the Williams Bakery Thrift Store.

The Williams Bakery Thrift Store is a small shop located next to Bean Complex and behind Hamilton Complex. The store sells bread, pastries, cookies and other items from its own bakery as well as day-old and older items from major grocery stores.

There is always a large selection of bargain bread items priced to sell at the outlet. Regular deals

include 5 loaves of Williams white bread for \$2.70 and packaged cupcakes for either 3 for \$1 or 5 for \$1. Another bargain is assorted breads at 3 for \$1 or 2 for \$1. This usually includes a selection of English muffins, bagels, dinner rolls, hot dog and hamburger buns and variety breads.

The thrift store also stocks a variety of almost-fresh pastries, doughnuts and muffins at discount

prices.

If you spend \$5 or more, you receive a 3 for \$1 bread item for free. Usually, however, it takes an awful lot of bread to equal that price.

The Williams Bakery Thrift Store is a great place to find bargains on bread items. And if you end up buying too much, you can always freeze the extras or walk over to the Eugene Millrace and share them with the ducks.
