

# Class: Frohnmayer's students say they expect a challenge

"The Prince," by Machiavelli; "Great Men, Great Thoughts and the Environment," by William James; and "On Becoming Servant Leaders," by Robert Greenleaf. Students will also be required to write one essay per week.

Students agree that it's going to be a challenging class, but they say it's worth it.

"You've just got to be on top of it; it just requires a lot of thinking," said Gabe Dailey, an accounting major.

When the class acquires a group identity, Frohnmayer said he wants to further challenge them by engaging in a game enti-

led "Diplomacy."

Through this game, Frohnmayer said the students will break into groups and learn what it's like to develop a policy for different nations.

"After that experience they should be able to reflect on what they learned about leadership," Frohnmayer said.

Frohnmayer's class is one of almost 50 freshman seminars offered each year, which aim to have smaller class sizes and discussion groups.

Bruch said the class size of 20 students contributes to his learning.

"Because it's a discussion course, it offers a forum for students to express themselves," he said. "You're not just getting ideas from textbooks, but from a professor and students. You can use the class as a sounding board for your ideas."

Dailey said the small class creates a laid back atmosphere.

"Everyone is easy going," he said. "Everyone wants to pitch in and give their point of view."

Bruch said one of the main benefits of the class is that all the students chose to take the class.

"All the students want to be there, they

are enthusiastic, and I think we'll feed off each other and drive each other to do better," he said.

So far, Frohnmayer said he's impressed with the students.

"They're really a mature, outgoing group," he said.

And the students are equally impressed with their instructor.

"He seems very enthusiastic," Bruch said. "He seems like somebody who really does want to get back to why he got into this profession — teaching. His enthusiasm will carry a long way."

"I think I could learn a lot from him."

**Knight Library offers Internet workshops**

The Knight Library is offering free Internet Curriculum Workshops for all students, faculty and staff. The classes range from topics concerning the World Wide Web and Web Publishing to how to use Lexis/Nexis and scan photos. The workshops are non-credit and are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

The Library courses are offered in cooperation with the University Computing Center and the University Career Center. Staff from the Computing center and the Career Center are volunteering time to teach the courses. Topics related to the World Wide Web include, "How to use browsers, other software and search engines."

Those who attend the courses may learn how to use animation formats such as animated GIF, Macromedia Director, Quicktime and Java. Students can also learn to explore full-time jobs, part-time jobs and internships on the Internet.
