Ducks split four tough matches

■ **WRESTLING:** Oregon beat Stanford and Cal State Bakersfield over weekend

The Oregon wrestling team came away from California with a 2-2 split over the weekend, which isn't bad considering the teams it went up against. Oregon had to take on two top 20 teams in a four-day, four-match trip.

The Ducks came away with a relatively easy Pacific-10 Conference victory over Stanford Thursday as Oregon downed the Cardinal 22-10. Cal Poly stole the meet away from Oregon in the final match on Friday, but the Ducks also blew an opportunity for a tie early in the meet.

The Ducks ended up losing 15-14, but in the fourth match Oregon received a one-point deduction for

unsportsmanlike conduct. That proved to be the winning point for Cal Poly. Chael Sonnen put the Ducks up 14-12 going into the last match, but Gan McGee took a 6-2 decision over Rich Polkinghorn in the heavyweight match to seal the win.

Saturday afternoon the Oregon squad turned things around against 13th-ranked Cal State Bakersfield, winning 22-18. The Ducks pulled away in the middle weights with three straight victories, and Sonnen won by forfeit in the 190-pound weight class to cinch up the win. Bakersfield's Jeremy Bridges, who normally wrestles at 190, didn't wrestle due to a staph infection that he acquired earlier in the week and the Bulldogs didn't have anyone to fill the gap for them.

Kevin Keeney's match at 167 pounds proved to be the turning point for the Ducks' victory.

Keeney came back in the final minutes of regulation to take Lionel Halsey to overtime tied at one point apiece. Keeney ended up winning 17 seconds into the overtime period, 3-1.

The 13th-ranked Fresno State Bulldogs came from behind in the final two matches to down Oregon 23-16 in the Ducks' last meet of the trip on Sunday. It was a back-and-forth match-up as the crowd saw two falls and three major decisions on the day. Oregon proved to be strong once again in the middle weights, but two wins, including a fall in the heavyweight match, was too much for Oregon to overcome.

Scott Norton was the only Duck to finish the road trip undefeated, recording four victories at 150, including one major decision. Sean Morgan, who filled in for Norton at 158, scored three wins as did Jeremy Ensrud at 134.

Injury-plagued Hardaway named All-Star

NEW YORK — Michael Jordan, the leading vote-getter in the history of the NBA All-Star game, on Sunday became the first player to receive more than 2 million votes in one season.

In final fan voting for the Feb. 9 game at Cleveland, the Chicago Bulls guard led all players in votes for a record eighth time with 2,451,136.

Joining Jordan in the Eastern

Conference starting lineup will be forwards Grant Hill of Detroit (1,868,020 votes) and Scottie Pippen of Chicago (1,683,956), center Patrick Ewing of New York (1,395,759) and guard Penny Hardaway of Orlando (1,132,024).

For the Western Conference, the starters will be forwards Charles Barkley of Houston (1,877,232) and Shawn Kemp of Seattle (1,713,049), center Hakeem Olajuwon of Houston (1,487,310) and guards Gary Payton of Seattle (1,206,539) and John Stockton of Utah (1,127,250).

The rest of the 12-man teams

will be selected by all the coaches in the respective conferences and announced this week. Houston's Rudy Tomjanovich will coach the West and Doug Collins of Detroit will coach the East.

Jordan, the MVP of last year's 129-118 East victory at San Antonio and the MVP in the 1988 game, will be playing in his 11th All-Star game.

During his career, he has received 12,009,832 votes. He also led the voting for seven consecutive seasons (1987-1993), before Barkley ended his streak in 1994. Hill was the top vote-getter in 1995 and 1996.
